Help Keep Your Temporary Business Signs Compliant

The City of Monterey Park wants to help businesses reach customers while complying with city regulations

The Code Compliance Division strives to promote a partnership with the community by building awareness of City of Monterey Park regulations. This month's article is aimed towards our business community and the use of temporary signs and banners.

General Guidelines for Allowable Temporary Signs

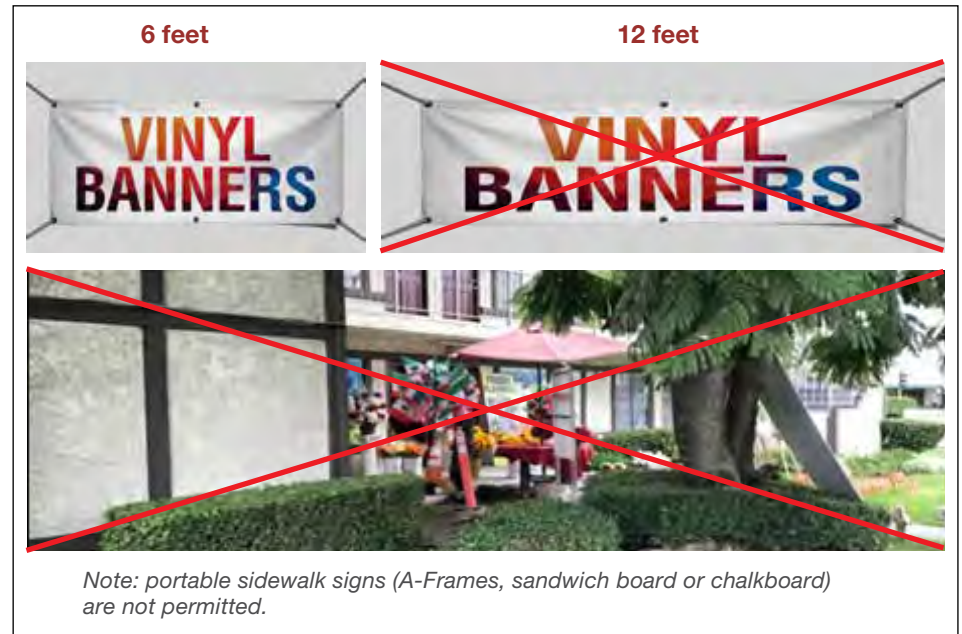
Business owners need to obtain a Temporary Use Permit from the Planning Department for temporary signs or banners to promote special business or promotional events.

Banner sign:

- Material may only be vinyl;
- Size may be up to 6 feet wide by 3 feet high;
- Must be displayed on the building storefront;
- Maximum of one (1) banner per building storefront;
- May not be displayed as a portable sign; and
- The promotion of merchandise using canopies or umbrellas is not permitted (see example).

The Code Compliance Division is authorized to ensure that sign regulations are enforced in collaboration with the Planning Division and Economic Development Department. The goal is to build a strong business community to help businesses grow and succeed when promoting special events and operations while following city regulations.

Code Compliance hopes the use of these guidelines for temporary signs and banners will assist in promoting your business. 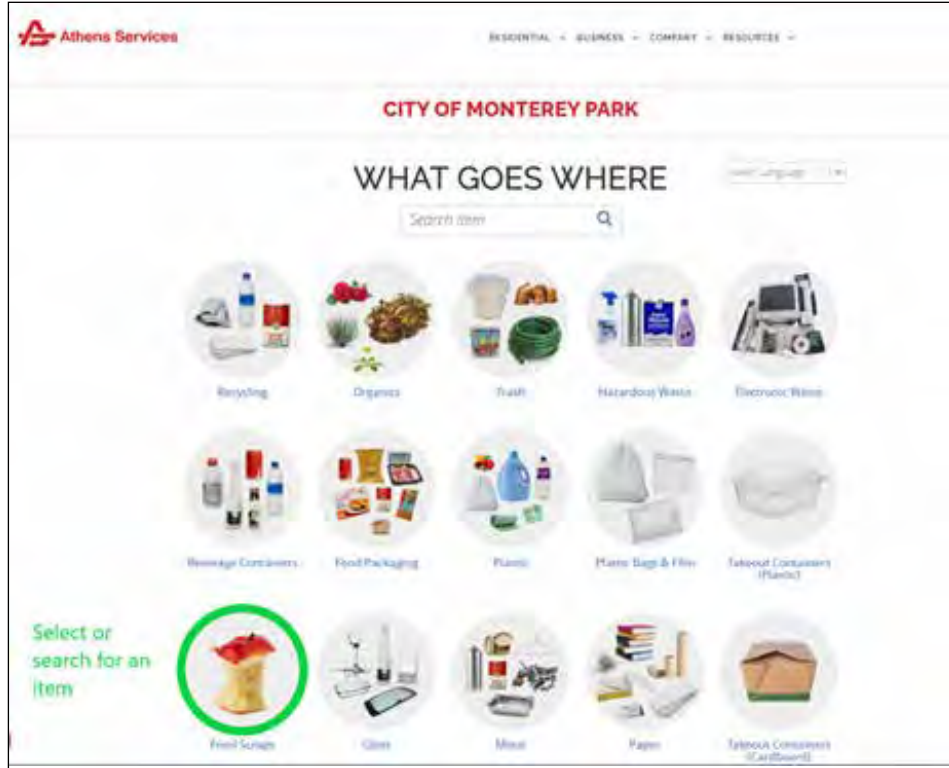

The Night Sky

On May 1 at 9:00 p.m. on the meridian (the line across the sky from north to south) the constellation of Leo the Lion's "head" is on this line. By May 31 at 9:00 p.m., the hind quarters of Leo are on the meridian.

At the beginning of May, the Sun sets at 7:37 p.m., and rises at 6:03 a.m. On the 31st, the Sun sets at 7:59 p.m. and rises at 5:43 a.m. As we approach the summer equinox on June 21, the nights continue to decrease in duration.

The Moon is at first quarter on the 8th, full on the 15th, last quarter on the 22nd, and new on the 30th.

Mercury sets at 9:19 p.m. on the 1st, and the Sun sets at 7:37 p.m., so Mercury sets one hour and 42 minutes after the Sun. By the 15th, Mercury will be too close to the Sun and is unobservable. By the 31st, Mercury rises in the morning sky at 5:08 a.m. and the Sun rises at 5:43 a.m., only 35 minutes later. So for May, Mercury is only visible at the beginning of the month. It is a disk 31% illuminated and only 8.4 arcseconds wide.

All other planets are in the morning sky.

On the 1st, Venus rises at 4:13 a.m. and the Sun rises at 6:04 a.m. The disk of Venus is 68% illuminated, and 17 arcseconds wide. By the 31st, Venus rises at 4:56 a.m. and its disk is 78% illuminated and 14 arcseconds wide. The disk of Venus decreases in size and increases in the portion that is illuminated as it moves to the far side of the Sun. The disk can be seen in binoculars or a small telescope. Venus starts May a degree east of Jupiter and moves further east each day.

Mars rises at 3:32 a.m. on the 1st. On the 31st, Mars rises at 2:33 a.m. It rises earlier each day. The disk of Mars is only 5.7 arcsecond wide and very small, so nothing will be seen in binoculars or a small telescope. On the 17th, Mars is about half a degree south of Neptune. On the 28th and 29th, Mars is about half a degree south of Jupiter.

On the 1st, Jupiter rises in the morning sky at 4:11 a.m. On the 31st, Jupiter rises at 2:28 a.m. Features on the disk, as well as the four Galilean moons are visible in a small telescope.

Saturn rise at 2:39 a.m. on the 1st and at 12:44 a.m. on the 31st. Features on the disk, the rings, and the large moon Titan are visible in a small telescope.

Uranus starts May too close to the Sun to be observed. On the 31st, the planet rises at 4:23 a.m. Because of this, for most of May, Uranus is not observable.

On the 15th, Uranus is at Right Ascension 2h, 54m, 29s and a Declination of +16° 16' 29". Uranus is only 3.4 arcseconds wide, so a large telescope and magnifications of 150x are needed to see its disk.



Neptune rises at 4:02 a.m. on the 1st and at 2:06 a.m. on the 31st. Neptune is at Right Ascension 23h 42m 6s and a Declination of -3° 3' 52" on the 15th. It is both faint, magnitude +8, and small at 3.2 arcseconds wide, so a large telescope and a magnification of at least 150x are needed to see its disk.

A total lunar eclipse will be visible from Los Angeles on the evening of May 15. The Moon enters the outer lighter portion of earth's shadow, the penumbra, at 6:21 p.m. It enters the inner darker portion of earth's shadow, the umbra, at 7:28 p.m. By 10:55 p.m., the Moon leaves the umbra. The eclipse ends at 11:51 p.m. when the Moon leaves earth's shadow. The eclipse is visible to the unaided eye, although binoculars will show more of the disk.

The Eta Aquariid meteor shower will be active from April 15 to May 27. The Eta Aquariids are a strong shower when viewed from the southern tropics, but from Los Angeles they produce medium rates of ten to 30 meteors per hour just before dawn. The meteors are swift with a high percentage of persistent trains, but few fireballs. The parent comet is the famous Halley's Comet. Halley produces two showers annually. The peak occurs on the night of May 4 to the morning of the 5th. The Moon will be a 15% illuminated crescent in the evening sky.

Los Angeles Astronomical Society operates the Garvey Ranch Observatory, located on the east side of Garvey Ranch Park. The observatory is open to the public every Wednesday night, from 7-10 p.m., as weather and conditions permit. More info is available at www.laas.org; www.facebook.com/losangelesastronomicalsociety; or 213-673-7355. Garvey Ranch Park is located at 781 S. Orange Avenue, Monterey Park, CA 91755.

Local Optometrists Deliver Essential Vision Screening to 8,000 AUSD Students

The pandemic prevented Alhambra USD's essential vision screening for students. After two years of missed screenings, AUSD schools needed to provide double or triple the number of screenings than in a typical year. In normal times, AUSD nurses facilitate initial vision screening for all students upon school entry and every third year thereafter to help catch potential vision issues early and prevent barriers to learning.

Screening over 8,000 students in less than six weeks is no small task, so AUSD called upon an army of local optometrists to lend a hand. Between March 15 and April 27, Dr. Wayne W. Hoeft, O. D. mobilized groups of local optometrists to deliver vision screening services at all 13 elementary schools, four high schools, and for students in our Virtual Learning programs. The final count of student screenings totaled 8,324!

The entire Hoeft family was instrumental in completing the vision screening process. Mrs. Lyn Hoeft, Wayne's wife, worked tirelessly behind the scenes, while Dr. Craig Hoeft — an optometrist like his father — joined him to provide screening services for our students. Superintendent Denise Jaramillo says, "AUSD is extremely grateful to the Hoeft family, the many local optometrists, site administrators, site nurses, and the Student Support Services Health division."

The final artworks submitted to California State PTA by districts are considered for Outstanding Interpretation, Awards of Excellence or Awards of Merit. Outstanding Interpretation and Award of Excellence entries represent California in the final National PTA judging round.

- 不得使用為便攜式標誌展示；和
- 不允許使用簷篷標誌或有廣告標誌的傘作為推銷工具(見示例)。

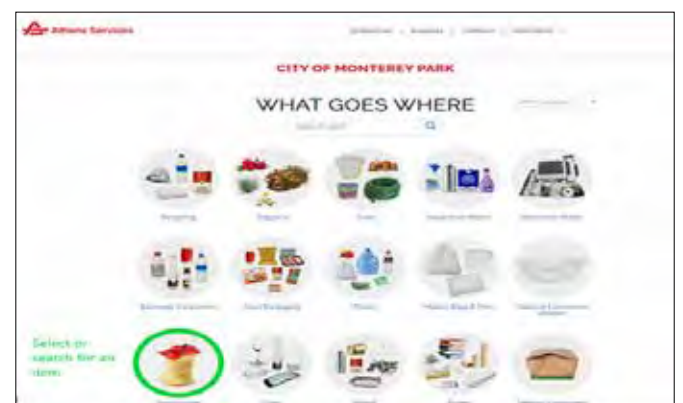

Normas Generales para los Letreros Temporales Permitidos

Los dueños de negocios necesitan obtener un Permiso de Uso Temporal de la División de Planificación para los letreros o estandartes temporales para promover eventos especiales de negocios o promocionales.

Estandarte:

- El material solo puede ser vinilo;
- El tamaño puede ser hasta 6 pies de ancho por 3 pies de alto;
- Debe desplegarse en la parte delantera del edificio;
- Máximo de un (1) estandarte en la parte delantera del edificio;
- No se puede desplegar como un letrero portátil; y
- No se permite la promoción de mercancía usando toldos o sombrillas (ver ejemplo).

La División de Code Compliance está autorizada a asegurarse que los reglamentos para los letreros sean cumplidos en colaboración con la División de Planificación y el Departamento del Desarrollo Económico. El objetivo es contruir una comunidad de negocios sólida para ayudar a los negocios a crecer y tener éxito cuando promueven eventos y operaciones especiales mientras que cumplen las regulaciones de la ciudad.

Code Compliance espera que el uso de estas normas para letreros y estandartes temporales ayude a promover su negocio. 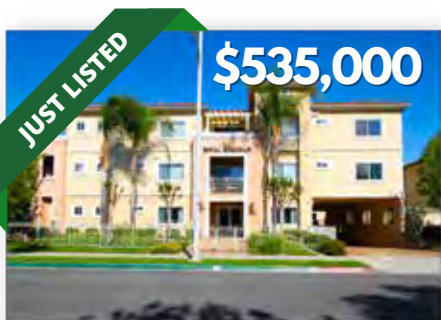

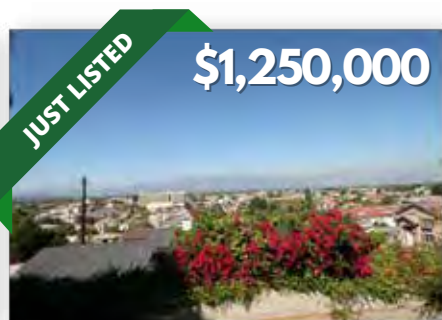

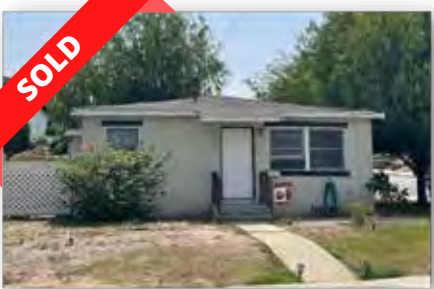
