Monterey Park Spirit Bus Returns to Service July 1

The City of Monterey Park is pleased to announce the return of Spirit Bus services on July 1, 2022

The City of Monterey Park's fixed-route transportation service, Spirit Bus, has been suspended since 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The City Council recently approved the renewal of its contract with First Transit, the City's bus system operator, to resume Spirit Bus services with slightly modified service.

Spirit Bus operations for Routes 1,2,3 and 4 will resume with service on Monday through Friday, with no service on Saturday or Sunday. Previously, bus service was provided on Saturdays for Routes 1,2,3 and 4. An updated bus schedule can be found on the City website and is also available at City Hall.

During this time, the City will be conducting an evaluation of its community transportation program to assess the system's efficiency and how to best meet the community's mobility needs. The City plans to release a community survey and will conduct future community meetings to provide the public an opportunity to provide input on the City's transportation program. Participation from all community members is highly encouraged to better understand the City's transportation and mobility needs.

Monterey Park will celebrate our American Independence Day holiday on Saturday, July 2 from 4 to 9 p.m. at Barnes Park. This community event features music by Electric Vinyl, food trucks and fun for the entire family. The fun filled day will conclude with the annual free fireworks show at 9 p.m.

The public is advised that the streets surrounding Barnes Park (McPherrin, Harding and Ramona Avenues) will be closed from 4-11 p.m. to be made available for the city's firework show viewing.

In the interest of general holiday safety, the Monterey Park Fire and Police Departments encourage fireworks safety and remind celebrants that there are fines for illegal use in the city. Illegal fireworks will be seized and fines of \$2,000-\$5,000 issued. Safe and Sane fireworks are only allowed for use on July 4 from 10 a.m.-10 p.m.

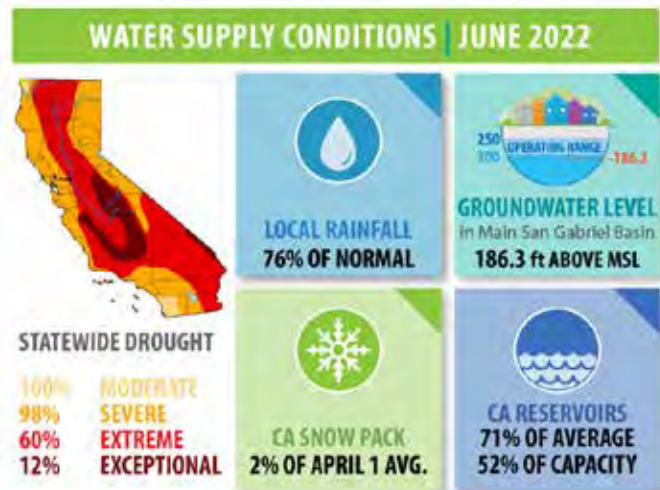


Saving Water ... It's a Good Thing

The San Gabriel Valley is in a serious drought and Monterey Park residents are asked to reduce their water usage by 15 percent

Summer's here and the San Gabriel Valley and California are facing worsening drought conditions. It is essential to understand the importance of conservation both outside and inside the home.

Below is a summary of the current City of Monterey Park Water Conservation Regulations:

1. Outdoor irrigation is restricted to two days a week on Monday and Thursday only.
2. No outdoor irrigation between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.*
3. No outdoor irrigation within 48 hours after measurable rain.
4. No outdoor irrigation that results in run-off from the property.
5. No washing down sidewalks, driveways or any paved surfaced.
6. All leaks must be repaired as soon as reasonably possible.
7. Car washing is restricted to commercial car wash or with hose with shutoff nozzle.

*Irrigating landscape in the early morning or late evening gives water a chance to percolate into the ground and provides planted areas with the most moisture.

Under this phase of restrictions, the city realizes that a number lawns and vegetation may brown or wither. However, please remember that weeds and other conditions preserving neighborhood aesthetics and fire safety must continue to be maintained.

Another way to keep a beautiful landscape is to plant Californian native plants. Plants native to the area require very little water, are attractive and readily available. Native

plant species specific to your address can be found at calscape.org.

Reducing water use can also save consumers money while extending the use of this precious resource for the future.

How can each Monterey Park resident play a role in saving water? Here are some tips on water conservation:

- Take shorter (five minute) showers.
- Fix leaks.
- Install aerators on your faucets.
- Turn off water when brushing teeth or shaving.
- Replace old toilets with modern ones that use less water to flush.
- Wash full loads of clothes.
- Use a dishwasher or two basin method if washing dishes by hand.
- Set lawn mower blades to 3".
- Replace lawns with California-native plants.
- Encouraging friends and family to conserve water.

The City of Monterey Park is a member of the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District (SGVMWD), which provides a robust rebate program to help residents conserve water both indoors and outdoors. Monterey Park residents are eligible for the following rebates for various water saving appliances and fixtures.

- Water efficient washing machines.
- High-efficiency toilet.
- Commercial waterless urinal.
- Rain barrel.
- Irrigation controller.
- Soil moisture system.
- Rotating sprinkler nozzle.
- Flow monitor device that provides data on use.
- Irrigation controller retrofit program.

November 8, 2022 General and Special Municipal Elections Info

The City of Monterey Park will conduct its General and Special Municipal Elections on Tuesday, November 8, 2022. The General and Special elections are consolidated with the Statewide General election conducted by the Los Angeles County Registrar Recorder's office.

Registered voters will cast ballots in their respective district for a City Council position in Council District Nos. 1 and 5, to serve a four-year term ending in November 2026; a City Council position in Council District No. 3 to serve a two-year term ending in November 2024; a City Clerk and a City Treasurer to serve a four-year term ending in November 2026; and any proposed ballot measures.

July 4th Holiday Safety

The Monterey Park Fire Department would like to remind residents that each year, injuries to children and adults are attributed to the misuse of fireworks. Thousands of dollars in property damage have resulted from unlawful use and handling of illegal fireworks and firecrackers. Please remember these safety tips when it comes to buying, using, or enjoying your fireworks.

- **Purchase and use only "Safe & Sane" fireworks**
Safe and Sane fireworks are the only permitted products allowed in the City of Monterey Park and only on July 4 from 10 a.m.-10 p.m.

Always purchase fireworks from approved stands and sales outlets within your community. To tell if fireworks are Safe & Sane, look for the official seal of the California State Fire Marshal on the box or individual products.

- **Children should not handle fireworks**
Watching fireworks is especially exciting for young children. While watching from a distance usually poses no safety threat, allowing children to light or handle fireworks is a dangerous practice. A responsible adult should supervise all fireworks activities. Never give fireworks to young children.

- **Follow lighting and safety instructions exactly**
Each safe and sane item will have directions for use. Follow these exactly as stated, and do not attempt to take apart a firework, or re-light a dud. Malfunctioning fireworks, or those you are unsure of, should be disposed of in a nearby bucket of water. Water should be kept on hand for emergencies.

- **Know where you can legally use fireworks**
Many communities do not allow the sale or use of fireworks. Fireworks are sold from approved, licensed stands from noon on June 28th to 9:00 p.m. on July 4th. For private use in Monterey Park, residents may use fireworks on their own personal property, in open yard areas, and/or within a driveway. Fireworks should never be lit near any structures or upon any overgrown or dry lawn, and should be kept away from any motor vehicles.

It is important to remember that fireworks cannot be used in city parks. Fireworks used contrary to these regulations are subject to immediate confiscation by authorities.

- **Fines of \$2,000 and up to \$5,000 for illegal fireworks**
Chapter 5.48 of the Monterey Park Municipal Code (MPMC) regulates the sale, use, discharge, and storage of safe and sane fireworks and prohibits the sale, use, discharge and storage of dangerous fireworks. The fines for all violations of Chapter 5.48 relating to fireworks are \$2,000. The unpermitted sale of Safe and Sane fireworks and sale of illegal fireworks is \$5,000.

In addition to fine, a citee is liable and responsible for the payment of actual costs associated with the collection, transportation, and disposal of any seized fireworks.

Street Rehabilitation and Slurry Seal programs to Get In Gear This Summer

The City of Monterey Park is actively seeking to improve residents' infrastructure. The Monterey Park City Council recently approved the acceptance of a "Street Bond" which will provide financial aid to improve our streets' conditions. Two projects will be taking place this year.

First, the Public Works Department will be starting a Street Rehabilitation project by placing a layer of asphalt rubber hot mix. This layer will provide greater longevity to the driving surface, and it is environmentally beneficial due to the use of recycled rubber. The Street Rehabilitation project will start in August 2022, with completion towards the end of the year.

Second, the department will be restarting its Slurry Seal Program in 2022. Slurry seal minimizes the aging of the existing road and corrects raveling and any other defects caused by weather elements. The Slurry Seal Program will start in August 2022, with a completion date of approximately October 2022.

Streets not included in this year's projects will be addressed as per the citywide Pavement Management Program.

Southern California Edison Upgrading Monterey Park Streetlight Poles Through July 2022

If you have noticed maintenance trucks on your street and a curb marking of "S/L" or temporary no parking signs along your block, then your street is due for the next series of streetlight pole replacements.

In a continuing effort to maintain and improve vital city infrastructure, the Monterey Park Public Works Department is working closely with Southern California Edison's (SCE) maintenance infrastructure upgrade project. The project calls for the replacement of 953 SCE-owned streetlight poles throughout the city. SCE and its approved contractor, SASCO, will replace old steel streetlights with new concrete poles and light fixtures. New pole locations will be designated by an "S/L" or "SL" curb marking.

The project began in mid-May and completion is scheduled for July 2022 with funding entirely by SCE

Although SCE does not anticipate power loss due to its work, it will be notifying impacted residents and business owners in advance of work commencing in their area. Questions regarding this project may be directed to SCE's streetlight program representative at 714-796-9869.

A Message Regarding Inoperative Vehicles

What Are Inoperative Vehicles?

An inoperative vehicle is a vehicle in a condition of being junked, wrecked, entirely or partially dismantled, discarded, has missing parts or equipment necessary to operate the vehicle safely and legally on a public right-of-way, including but not limited to any flat tires or any part of said vehicle being supported by jacks, blocks or other supports. An operable vehicle is a vehicle that is well maintained and has the ability to be driven.

Where Can You Park Inoperative Vehicles?

Inoperative vehicles may have an appropriate fitting vehicle cover, and can be parked in an area designated/ designed for parking and the paved surface must be maintained. Inoperable vehicle may also be parked or stored so that the vehicles

are not visible from the street or neighboring properties. In order to maintain the attractiveness and safety of the community, vehicles cannot be parked on any landscaped area.

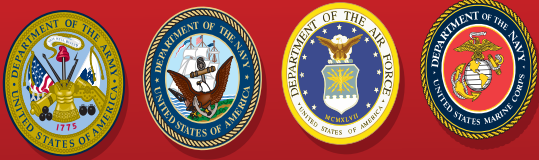

AUSD + 11 AUSD Schools Win 2022 CA Pivotal Practice Awards

California introduced the 2022 California Pivotal Practice (CAPP) Awards to recognize the innovative efforts by schools and districts during Distance Learning. One of 121 school districts in the state to receive the award, Alhambra Unified School District was honored for demonstrating support for students in student engagement, distribution of technology, nutritional services, and/or social emotional well-being.

In addition to the district's award, eight AUSD elementary schools and all three comprehensive high schools were recognized with CAPP Awards.

"I'm incredibly proud of these schools and districts for their creativity, dedication, and innovation in the face of adversity," State Superintendent Tony Thurmond said.

The AUSD schools singled out for their unique pandemic strategies during the 2020-21 school year include Alhambra, Mark Keppel, and San Gabriel High Schools, along with Brightwood, Garfield, Granada, Martha Baldwin, Monterey Highlands, Park, Ramona, and William Northrup Elementary Schools. The schools focused primarily on social emotional well-being of students and student engagement. Pivotal Practices included: staying connected through the arts, virtual assemblies, student drive-thru celebrations, take-home culinary kits, and redesigning learning to meet student needs.

CAPP Award winners completed an online application highlighting an innovative practice in one of the four target areas implemented during the 2020-21 school year. In 2023, CDE will likely transition back to the California Distinguished Schools Program.



Brightwood School was one of 11 schools to earn a 2022 California Pivotal Practice Award. The school's pivotal practice was their STAR Student of the Month Drive-Thru celebrations held in partnership with the Monterey Park Fire Department. Ten other AUSD schools and the district also received CAPP Awards.

Asian Latino Mark Keppel Students Talk to LA Times About Dual Heritage Identity

Los Angeles Times reporters Brittany Mejia and Anh Do reached out to AUSD last fall for help in finding Asian Latino students to interview for a story on the fastest growing population in California. It wasn't easy. In a district where 66% of students are Asian and 22% are Latino, few students are both.

The district found four dual heritage, bicultural Asian Latino Mark Keppel students who gathered in the school cafeteria in September to talk to Mejia and Do about how they navigate their mixed identities. Nearby photojournalist Irfan Khan was snapping photos.

Emily Ortega Liu's mother is Mexican and her father is Chinese. She was the only student who was trilingual. Emiko Luna Hernandez's mother is Japanese Mexican and her father Mexican. Isaac Guo Meyer's father is Mexican and his mother Chinese. Matthew Sy's mother is Chinese and his father Salvadoran.

夏天到了，聖蓋博谷和加州正面臨著日益惡化的干旱狀況。人人有責大家都需要知道室內或室外節約用水的重要性。

以下是當前蒙特利公園市節約用水的市規條例：

1. 室外草坪或植物澆水僅限每週兩天，僅限週一和週四。
2. 上午 9:00 至下午 5:00 之間禁止戶外澆水*
3. 下雨後 48 小時內不得進行室外澆水。
4. 室外澆水時不得導致水徑流到街道。
5. 禁止沖洗人行道、車道或任何鋪砌的路面。
6. 所有漏水的設備必須盡快維修。
7. 洗車可在商業洗車進行或使用裝有自動關閉噴嘴的水管。

*在清晨或傍晚給草坪澆水，使水更有機會滲入地下，並可以為種植區域提供最多的水分。

在這節約用水的限制下，蒙市意識到許多草坪和植物可能會變黃或枯萎。但要記住，必須繼續保持草坪和植物的生態，保持社區的美感同時維持防火的條件。

保持美麗景觀的另一種方法是種植加州本土植物。加州地區的原生植物需要很少量的水去維持美觀，並且植物外觀很有吸引力也很容易購買到。可以在 calscape.org 上找到特定於您地區的本地植物種類。

減少用水量還可以為消費者節省金錢，同時把這種寶貴的資源留給未來使用。

- 將舊馬桶更換使用水量較少的省水馬桶。

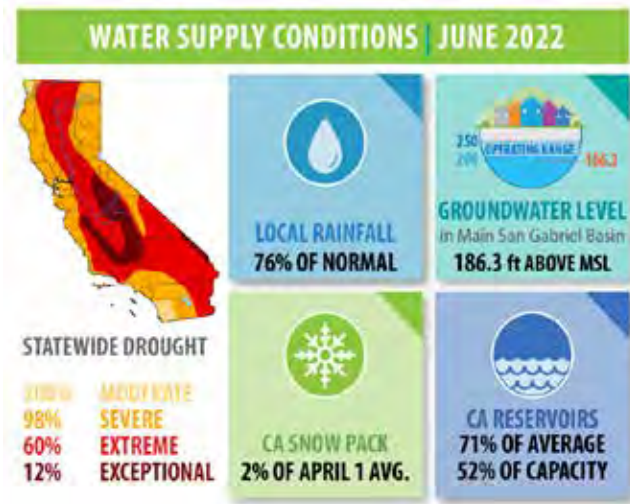
- 用洗衣機洗衣服時盡量洗大容量。

Ahorrar Agua ... Es Algo Bueno

El Valle de San Gabriel está en una grave sequía y se les pide a los residentes de Monterey Park que reduzcan el consumo de agua un 15 por ciento Por el Personal de la División de Agua

El verano está aquí y el Valle de San Gabriel y California están enfrentando condiciones de sequía cada vez peores. Es esencial entender la importancia de la conservación tanto en el exterior como en el interior del hogar.

A continuación se muestra un resumen de las Regulaciones de Conservación de Agua actuales de la Ciudad de Monterey Park:

1. El regar afuera está restringido a dos días a la semana, solo los lunes y jueves.
2. No regar afuera entre las 9:00 a.m. y las 5:00 p.m.*
3. No regar afuera dentro de las 48 horas después de una lluvia medible.
4. No irrigar afuera que resulte en derrames desde su propiedad.
5. No lavar las aceras, caminos de entrada o cualquier superficie pavimentada.
6. Todas las fugas deben repararse tan pronto como sea razonablemente posible.
7. El lavado de carros está restringido al lavado de autos comercial o con manguera con boquilla de cierre.

*Regar los jardines temprano en la mañana o al final de la tarde le da al agua la oportunidad de filtrarse en la tierra y proporciona a las áreas plantadas la mayor cantidad de humedad.

Bajo esta fase de restricciones, la ciudad se da cuenta que un buen número de céspedes y vegetación se pueden secar y marchitarse. Sin embargo, por favor recuerde que la maleza y otras condiciones preservan la estética del vecindario y la seguridad contra incendios se debe continuar manteniendo.

Otra manera de mantener un bello jardín es plantando plantas nativas de California. Las plantas nativas del área requieren muy poca agua, son atractivas y fácilmente disponibles. Las especies de plantas nativas específicas para su dirección se pueden encontrar en calscape.org.

Reducir el consumo de agua también puede ahorrarles dinero a los consumidores mientras que extiende el uso de este preciado recurso para el futuro.

¿Cómo puede cada residente de Monterey Park desempeñar un papel en el ahorro del agua? Aquí hay algunos consejos para la conservación de agua:

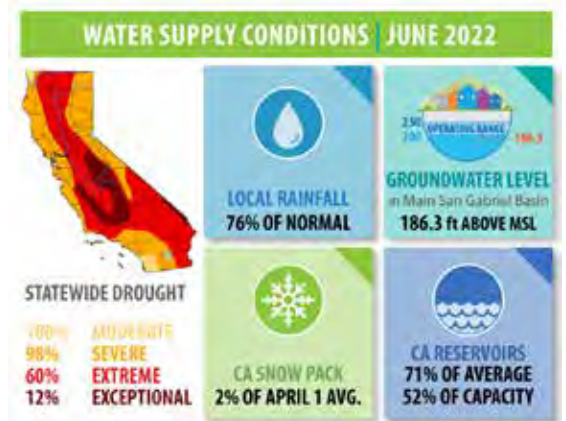
- Tomar duchas más cortas (cinco minutos).
- Arreglar las fugas.
- Instalar aireadores en sus grifos.
- Cerrar el agua cuando se cepille los dientes o se afeite.

- Reemplazar los inodoros viejos por unos modernos que usen un flujo de menos agua.
- Lavar cargas completas de ropa.
- Usar un lavaplatos o un método de dos lavabos si lava los platos a mano.
- Ajustar las cuchillas de la cortadora de césped a 3".
- Reemplazar el césped con plantas nativas de California.
- Animar a los amigos y familiares a conservar agua.

- Sistema de humedad de la tierra.
- Boquilla de aspersion giratoria.
- Dispositivo que verifica el flujo y que proporciona datos sobre el uso.
- Programa de actualización del controlador de riego.
