Springtime Adventure Awaits at the MPK Egg Hunt on April 17

Let the hunt begin! On Thursday, April 17, 2025, from 4–7 p.m., the Recreation and Community Services Department will host the MPK Spring Egg Hunt at Barnes Park. Attendees will enjoy free carnival games, a special appearance from Peter Rabbit and massive age group egg hunts.

Registration and Wristband Info

To ensure a smooth and organized experience, all participants in ages 4 and up must have a wristband to join their designated age group egg hunt.

To avoid long lines, participants are encouraged to pre-register and pick up their wristbands prior to the event. A limited number of wristbands will be available the day of the event for anyone who hasn't picked up their wristbands or didn't pre-register. Pre-registration will be required for the Big Hoppers (ages 4 and up) to secure a wristband for their designated age group.

Registration will begin on Monday, March 10, 2025 at 8 a.m. with spaces to be limited to 500 participants per age group. Wristbands can be obtained by registering online at www.montereypark.ca.gov/mpkegg hunt.

Wristbands will be available for early pick-up at Langley Senior Center at 400 W. Emerson Ave., starting Monday, April 7, 2025, from 8 a.m.–5 p.m. Alternatively, wristbands can be obtained on the day of the event starting at 4 p.m. Wristbands must be picked up prior to the start time of the corresponding age group's egg hunt.

Event Schedule

Little Bunnies (0-3 years old) will have an egg hunt available from 4:30–6 p.m. in the Patio Area between the Barnes Park Gym and tennis courts. For this age group, all eggs collected will only be used as a photo opportunity and can be redeemed for a prize after the egg hunt. Wristbands are not required for Little Bunnies ages 0–3.

Big Hoppers (4 years and up) can hunt for eggs with their age groups at their respective times:

- 4–6 years at 5 p.m.
- 7–9 years at 5:45 p.m.
- 10–12 years at 6:30 p.m.

In total, over 20,000 eggs will be spread out throughout the event, each containing a prize!

Before and after the egg hunts, attendees can play carnival games for candy and prizes. The egg hunts and all activities are free and do not require any registration beyond securing a wristband for the Big Hoppers. Various food trucks and the weekly Farmers' Market will also be on-site for those looking to grab a bite to eat.

City Holding Community Meetings on Monterey Pass Road Improvement Project

The City of Monterey Park is embarking on a project on Monterey Pass Road to improve traffic flow with state-of-the-art technology, improve public transit/bus flow and incorporate bus shelters and amenities for bus riders, improve sidewalks to increase mobility and safety, and improve/promote bicycle use by adding bicycle lanes. This project is funded by Los Angeles Metro and is located on Monterey Pass Road from Floral Drive to the Garvey/Fremont Avenue intersection. The project covers approximately 1.6 miles. The City hired Kimley Horn & Associates to design the Monterey Pass Complete Street Project.

The City will be holding three community outreach meetings to get input from the Community.

There will be two in-person meetings at the Langley Senior Center Friendship room, located at 400 W. Emerson Ave. in the City of Monterey Park.

What's in the Sky for March

Pacific Daylight Time, or PDT, begins on Sunday, March 9 at 2 a.m. Set all clocks one hour ahead, according to the saying, "Spring forward, fall back." The **Moon** is at first quarter on March 6, full on the 13th, last quarter on the 22nd, and new on the 29th.

Special Events

Spring begins in Earth's northern hemisphere and autumn in the southern hemisphere at 2:01 a.m., on March 20. When the Sun reaches this point where the ecliptic crosses the celestial equator, it moves from south to north. The point where and the time when the Sun crosses the celestial equator to the north is the vernal equinox. Spring ends with the summer solstice on June 20.

A **total lunar eclipse** occurs on March 13. The eclipse begins at 10:09 p.m. with mid-eclipse at 11:59 p.m. and ends on the 14th at 1:48 a.m. This is an umbral lunar eclipse, when the Moon travels through the inner, darker portion of earth's shadow and dims significantly. Depending on the condition of earth's atmosphere, the Moon can appear as any shade from bright red to almost black.

In the **major lunar standstill** of 2024-25, the March northernmost Moon occurs with the setting of the first quarter moon on the evening of March 6 and the rising of the Moon on the morning of the 7th. The southernmost excursion occurs on the 22nd, with the last quarter moon. Other Solar System Events

On **March 1** the **Sun** rises at 6:21 a.m. and sets at 5:50 p.m. **Saturn** is close to the Sun all month long, and it is not safe to observe it. Do not observe any planet when it appears close to the Sun, for the danger to the eyes is great. **Mercury** sets in the west at 7:07 p.m., one hour 17 minutes after sunset. Mercury is a gibbous phase, 76-percent illuminated and 6.0 arcseconds wide. On the 16th, the Sun sets at 7:02 p.m., and Mercury sets in the west at 8:04 p.m., one hour two minutes later. Mercury is a thin crescent, 15-percent illuminated and 9.3 arcseconds wide. After the 16th, Mercury is close to the Sun, and it is not safe to observe it. Do not observe any planet when it appears close to the Sun, for the danger to the eyes is great. **Neptune** sets in the west at 7:09 p.m., one hour 19 minutes after the Sun sets, with a disk 2.2 arcseconds wide. For this dim planet, the strong twilight will prevent observing it. After the 6th, Neptune is close to the Sun for the rest of March, and it is not safe to observe it. The position of

Neptune on the 15th is Right Ascension 23h 59m 51s with a declination of -01° 23' 28". **Venus** sets in the west-northwest at 8:13 p.m. Venus is a thin crescent, 15-percent illuminated and 49 arcseconds wide. On the 15th, the Sun sets at 7:01 p.m., and Venus sets in the west-northwest at 8:01 p.m., one hour later. The planet is a very thin crescent, 3.4-percent illuminated and 58 arcseconds wide. After the 15th, Venus is close to the Sun, and it is not safe to observe it. Do not observe any planet when it appears close to the Sun, for the danger to the eyes is great. Venus will appear in the morning sky in April. **Uranus** sets in the west-northwest at 12:36 a.m. The planet transitions from the constellation of Aries the Ram to Taurus the Bull on the 4th. On the 15th, Uranus is at Right Ascension 03h 26m 59s with a declination of +18° 34' 00". The disk of Uranus is only 3.5 arcseconds wide, and so a telescope with a magnification of 150x is needed. **Jupiter** is in the constellation Taurus the Bull. Jupiter sets in the west-northwest at 1:05 a.m. and is 40 arcseconds wide. A telescope capable of magnification 50x will show the Red Spot, and the four bright Galilean moons can be seen moving back and forth, across and behind Jupiter. **Mars** is in the constellation Gemini the Twins. Mars sets in the northwest at 3:52 a.m., and is nearly a full phase, 94-percent illuminated and 11 arcseconds wide. Its width continues to reduce as the earth moves away from the planet. On the 8th, Mars is less than two degrees west-southwest of the first quarter moon. A magnification of 150x is needed to see its small disk.

On **March 31** the Sun rises at 6:41 a.m. and sets at 7:14 p.m. **Saturn**, **Mercury**, **Venus**, and Neptune are close to the Sun and cannot be safely observed. Do not observe any planet when it appears close to the Sun, for the danger to the eyes is great. **Uranus** sets at 10:40 p.m. Uranus is only 3.5 arcseconds wide, and so a telescope with a magnification of 150x is needed. **Jupiter** sets in the west-northwest at 12:24 a.m. and is 36 arcseconds wide. A telescope capable of magnification 50x will show the Red Spot, and the four bright Galilean moons can be seen moving back and forth, across and behind Jupiter. **Mars** sets in the northwest at 3:14 a.m. and is a fat gibbous phase, 91-percent illuminated and 8.3 arcseconds wide, 60-percent as wide as it was at opposition on Jan 16. A magnification of 150x is needed to see its small disk.

Garvey Ranch Observatory is located on the east end of Garvey Ranch park. Parking is available on the west side of South Orange Avenue, south of Graves Avenue. The observatory is open every Wednesday night from 7:30-10 p.m. and staffed by volunteers from the Los Angeles Astronomical Society. Admission and viewing through the telescope are free. Alhambra High School Wins Back-to-Back LA County Academic Decathlon Titles

Alhambra High School's Academic Decathlon team has once again proven itself as a powerhouse, securing the Los Angeles County championship for the second year in a row. With an impressive overall score of 47,430, the team claimed First Place Overall and First Place in the highly competitive Division 1 Super Quiz event.

At this year's award luncheon, held on February 13th at the Queen Mary in Long Beach, awards and rankings were announced. By the end of the afternoon, the AHS team earned a staggering 74 individual medals, including 41 gold medals, showcasing the exceptional talent and knowledge of its decathletes, who studied and prepared for 10 categories focused on this year's theme of "Our Changing Climate." One of the team's standout performances came in the Speech category, where four students won gold medals, including Cesar Gonzalez, who delivered a flawless speech and earned a perfect score of 1,000.

AHS' decathletes also dominated in individual scoring. Kevin San was the highest scorer not only in the Honors category but in all of Los Angeles County, earning an impressive 9,485 points. Right behind him was teammate and twin brother I Kenneth San, who secured the second-highest overall score in the county with 9,060 points. Meanwhile, Oscar Diaz emerged as the top scorer in the Scholastic division with 7,216 points.

Reflecting on his team's success, Coach expressed immense pride in their achievements. "This team embodies hard work, dedication, and an unwavering commitment to excellence. Winning back-to-back titles is no small feat, and these students have set a standard for future AHS teams to follow. I couldn't be prouder of each and every one of them."

The strong showing from Alhambra Unified School District extended to the other two district high schools, as Mark Keppel High School finished in second place with a total score of 46,307 and will join AHS in advancing to the California Academic Decathlon State Finals March 20-23 in Santa Clara. MKHS was also awarded recognition as the Most Improved team, besting their previous year's score by 18,207 points. Meanwhile, San Gabriel High School's score of 34,739 earned them 12th place overall and qualified the team for the State's virtual AcaDec competition on March 8th, ensuring that all three AUSD high schools will continue their competitive journey and be represented at the next level.

With their sights now set on a strong showing against statewide competitors, Alhambra, Mark Keppel, and San Gabriel teams will continue to prepare for the rigorous competition ahead, carrying the pride of their schools and our entire community with them.
