Citizenship Preparation in Spanish and English at the Monterey Park Bruggemeyer Library

Monterey Park, Calif. - January 6, 2016 - Come learn about the eligibility requirements for applying for citizenship and benefits new citizens will qualify for. Information about the fee waiver for the new revised N-400 applications will be explained along with discussions on the myths regarding the citizenship process. Attendees will also learn how to apply to become new citizens.

The mission of the Monterey Park Bruggemeyer Library is to meet the cultural, educational, and informational needs of the residents of the City of Monterey Park by providing free and open access to its resources and services. The LAMP Program is primarily a volunteer based adult literacy program, serving adults and families who struggle with English proficiency and basic language skills through classes of various levels, individualized tutoring, as well as citizenship preparation classes. To date, the LAMP Program has helped over 1,500 adults to become U.S. citizens and close to 8,000 children and adults become better English speakers, readers and writers.

The Monterey Park Bruggemeyer Library is the city's public library located at 318 S. Ramona Avenue, Monterey Park, CA 91754.
