# PARKS PASS PROGRAM

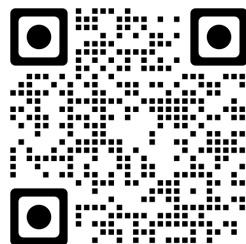
*Through a partnership with California State Parks and the California State Library, free State Parks vehicle day-use passes are now available to check out at the Monterey Park Bruggemeyer Library. These passes check out for 7 days and allow access to over 200 beautiful parks, lakes, beaches and monuments in the State Parks system for free.*



## HOW TO CHECKOUT A PARKS PASS

- A valid library card must be presented at the time of checkout.
- Patrons may only check out one pass at a time.
- Patrons can place a hold on passes currently checked out through our catalog at <https://library.montereypark.ca.gov/catalog>
- Pass can be checked out for seven days and is not renewable.
- Pass must be returned to the Circulation Desk.

## FAQS

**Is the pass valid at all 279 state parks?**

No. The State Library Parks Pass is valid for vehicle day use at over 200 participating state park units of the California State Park System operated by State Parks. It is not valid at units operated by federal and local government, private agencies or concessionaires. Also, the pass is not valid for per-person entry or tour fees (such as museums), boat use, camping, group use or sites, special events, additional/extra vehicle fees, sanitation disposal use or for supplemental fees. **Can the pass be used for national parks or city parks?**

No, the pass is only valid for the over 200 participating state park units.

**What happens if I lose the pass or the pass is stolen?**

Please contact the Monterey Park Bruggemeyer Library and let us know your pass was lost or stolen.

**Do I have to pay for the Parks Pass?**

No. The Parks Pass is free.
