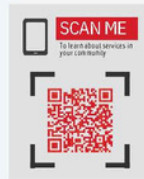

# CHINATOWN SERVICE CENTER

In 1971, the Chinatown Service Center (CSC) was established to address the many challenges faced by Chinese immigrants, including language barriers, cultural adjustment, limited access to essential services, and economic hardships. Many new arrivals struggled to communicate, find jobs, and navigate unfamiliar systems, while also facing discrimination and racism. CSC, with its outreach program led by the pastor of the Chinese United Methodist Church, sought to provide the resources and support necessary to help immigrants adjust to their new lives in America.

In 1975, CSC was incorporated as a nonprofit organization with support from Judge Ronald Lew and other community leaders. With assistance from the Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association (CCBA), CSC received its first government grant to operate an employment service program, setting the stage for future expansions.

By 1991, CSC had established its current office in Alpine Towers Plaza, consolidating all services under one roof by 1998. CSC expanded to Monterey Park in 1992, followed by the opening of a Youth Center in 2001. Over the years, CSC broadened its healthcare services, opening multiple medical and dental clinics across Alhambra and Monterey Park, including specialized care in 2019.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, CSC remained a pillar of support, offering vaccines, hot meals, and mobile services. In 2020, CSC was designated as a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) and expanded its behavioral health services. The center has been instrumental in disaster relief, from the 1992 Los Angeles Riots to aiding victims of the 2023 Monterey Park mass shooting, establishing the Monterey Park Community Healing Fund in partnership with the city and the California Community Foundation.

In 2024, CSC Health was recognized by L.A. Care as a top-performing clinic in the chronic care category and received the Gold Health Quality Leadership Badge from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), highlighting its commitment to high-quality healthcare. Additionally, CSC is excited to announce the upcoming opening of a new CSC Health Center and PACE Center in Alhambra.

Today, Chinatown Service Center is the largest community-based Chinese American health and human service organization in Southern California. It provides a comprehensive range of services, organized into: Social Services, Behavioral Health, Medical, Dental, Optometry, Community Economic Development, Workforce, Simulation Center, and Youth Center. These services are available in various languages, including English, Spanish, Cantonese, Mandarin, Toisan, Chiu Jou, Vietnamese, and Khmer (Cambodian).

From a single individual in a church, our journey has grown into a lifeline for nearly 32,000 clients by 2023. This incredible growth is a testament to the unwavering support and generosity of those who believe in our mission. We are profoundly grateful that you stand with us in our commitment to creating thriving lives in empowered communities. With your continued support, CSC can reach beyond the AAPI community, extending a helping hand to everyone in need. Your contributions are woven into the fabric of our history—together, we are not just building a better community; we are building hope, resilience, and a brighter future for all.
