Please share this message with the relevant members of the decision making team on my behalf pertaining to item 10B.

I am here to express my deepest concerns with the city of Monterey Park considering the installment of a data center. I fear that the installment of this data center would significantly decrease the overall quality of life of the city's residents as well as those who neighbor it and thus am here to push back on this plan.

Despite the temptation of filling up unused space with advance technology that can contribute to adding additional convenience to people's lives as well as receiving the the funds to do so, it is most apparent that we also consider the following impacts a data center will have on the people living near it:

Increased fresh water consumption

Data centers require water to keep its machines from overheating - a lot of it. This will increase the demand for water to our area significantly, likely leading to the increasing cost of water, an absolute necessity in people's lives (the same water that people use to drink, cook and wash in). In a time where people are living paycheck to paycheck we cannot afford to raise the price of water on people.
