Hello,

I am providing public comment on Item 10B regarding the proposed data center at 1977 Saturn Drive.

I work on a public project currently undergoing CEQA review. Despite having many vocal supporters and providing direct public benefit over a much larger service area than Monterey Park, we spent several months on the Notice of Preparation, held four community meetings, and conducted a 45-day scoping comment period before beginning our EIR. My agency took this proactive approach to ensure public comments are captured and evaluated comprehensively.

In my personal opinion, a full EIR is necessary for this project for similar reasons. While I won't weigh in on the legal requirements as I'm not a lawyer, full transparency and public comment are strongly advisable for a project of this significance.

My personal experience suggests an EIR will likely show the No Project alternative as least impactful, given the high emissions, water usage, and power consumption relative to current levels. This makes the Project Objective critical: what demonstrable benefit justifies these impacts? Currently, the project appears to provide no measurable benefit to the area, raising the question of why the City would consider approval.

An EIR would explicitly capture the Project Objective through CEQA and allow public comment on it and the estimated impacts. This addresses the core issue: the City has not shown what benefit this project provides. Thus, the community is demanding that environmental impacts be studied and disclosed through an EIR to demonstrate that benefits adequately justify the environmental costs.

Without a full EIR, moving forward will become increasingly difficult. An MND at this point would signal that City Council is overriding the public's request for transparency, which will only intensify opposition. I foresee that negative press coverage, protests, and other 'black eyes' would await the City and City Council if the project continues to move with an MND. An EIR would be the first step to demonstrate the City's commitment to full disclosure and community inclusion in evaluating this significant project.

I am writing to submit my public comment in strong opposition to Item 10B on the December 3, 2024 City Council agenda concerning the proposed HMC Capital data center project at 1977 Saturn Street. This project represents a fundamental transfer of environmental and economic burden from a foreign investment corporation onto Monterey Park residents who will receive virtually no benefit in return.

The city's use of a Mitigated Negative Declaration instead of a full Environmental Impact Report is wholly inadequate for a project of this magnitude. The proposed facility would consume 434 million kilowatt hours of electricity annually, more than triple our entire city's current energy use. Recent studies have found that data centers account for over four percent of total United States electricity consumption, with more than half sourced from fossil fuels, contributing to over 105 million tons of carbon dioxide equivalent emissions. Research from the University of Michigan's Ford School of Public Policy demonstrates that data centers strain local resources and infrastructure while providing very few real benefits to communities. Characterizing this massive energy burden as having no significant impact is a misrepresentation that denies residents our right to informed decision-making. A comprehensive Environmental Impact Report must assess impacts on our electrical grid, air quality from 14 diesel backup generators, water consumption, greenhouse gas emissions, noise pollution, and cumulative effects on community health and infrastructure.

The economic case for this project collapses under scrutiny. HMC Capital is an Australian investment firm managing over ten billion dollars in assets, currently building a global data center empire through acquisitions across North America and Australia. Despite claims of job creation, data centers typically generate few permanent positions relative to the scale of public subsidy they receive. The massive energy demand will drive up electricity rates for residents and small businesses as utilities expand infrastructure and pass costs onto ratepayers. Monterey Park residents will pay for grid upgrades, transmission lines, and water system improvements that primarily benefit this corporation. This is wealth extraction, not economic development.

The public health implications are severe and well-documented. Communities near large data centers are regularly exposed to dirty air and water that cause respiratory issues and other health problems. The facility's 14 emergency diesel generators will be tested monthly, releasing significant amounts of particulate matter, nitrogen oxides, sulfur dioxide, and carbon

dioxide. Diesel exhaust contains fine particles that embed in lungs and bloodstreams, causing heart and lung disease, with children, elderly residents, and those with respiratory conditions particularly vulnerable. The constant noise from servers, cooling systems, and industrial fans creates persistent pollution affecting sleep, concentration, and mental health.

The approval process has been fundamentally flawed. A nine-member committee cannot legitimately represent an entire city, particularly when several members have professional or personal ties to city officials. Councilmember Wong served as SPARC chair throughout the process, only recusing himself at the final meeting despite ongoing conflict of interest. Community-wide support allegedly rests on approximately 40 votes, many from individuals closely connected to City Council members or the applicant. Community alternatives such as mixed-use development and parks were not meaningfully pursued. This does not constitute democratic legitimacy.

From a climate perspective, this project undermines any environmental commitments our city has made. Data centers were responsible for one percent of energy-related greenhouse gas emissions in 2020, with projections showing that figure more than doubling by 2035. Global demand from data centers is set to more than double over the next five years. The International Energy Agency states clearly that to meet net zero emissions targets by 2050, emissions must be cut in half by 2030. Monterey Park should be reducing our carbon footprint, not tripling energy consumption to power artificial intelligence and cloud computing for a foreign corporation. Communities from Memphis, Tennessee, to River Rouge and Ypsilanti, Michigan, are fighting data center expansion because they recognize these facilities as creating sacrifice zones where environmental harm is concentrated for the benefit of distant stakeholders.

Construction timelines for new data centers often outpace upgrades to grid and transmission infrastructure. Several jurisdictions have already paused new data center projects to process connection backlogs and evaluate grid capacity. This project threatens the stability and reliability of Monterey Park's electrical grid when infrastructure failures fall hardest on vulnerable populations including elderly residents, families, and those dependent on electrically powered medical equipment.

I urge the City Council to reject this project and require a full Environmental Impact Report if any data center proposal is reconsidered. The Council should prioritize development that serves Monterey Park residents, including affordable housing, community facilities, parks, and local businesses. Future planning processes must ensure meaningful community representation beyond token committees. The Council must protect residents from utility rate increases caused by industrial-scale energy users.

Monterey Park deserves development that serves the people who live here, not projects that extract value for distant investors. Please vote no on Item 10B and enter this email into the public record.

I have a few questions concerning certain comments Maychelle Yee has made on an instagram post (by @/sgvprogressiveaction) concerning the data center of Item 10B.

- 1) She claims she made recommendations to the developer and council on how to build the data center more efficiently and sustainably. What was proposed exactly? If the methods are really that effective in practice, that sounds awesome. However, for transparency, may the residents receive more insight via a full EIR?
- 2) Even if "people will write/say whatever you want if you pay them," we should still have more information via a full EIR. Please do not preclude transparency and access to knowledge with semantics.
- 3) The data center will not be a "quiet neighbor." Last I have heard, 14 4MW emergency diesel engines are involved, among other equipment ([datacenterdynamics.com](#) article concerning Australian firm HMC Capital in Monterey Park). Please consider again--would the average person still want to live next to this operation? Significant clusters of residential areas surround the 1977 Saturn Street property, including the newly built condos along Portrero Grande not even a mile away from the location, whose property values may tank because of the proximity to 1977 Saturn Street. No, not everyone will be able to work with these living conditions. No, not everyone will agree.
- 4) Surely, more security guards can be involved with the 1977 Saturn Street property without the excuse of the data center, especially if the area is actually being developed properly for the community. Again, please consider mixed use, parks, and retail.
- 5) How will the cost of the resulting increased electricity bill be handled in the city of Monterey Park? How will the increased water consumption be handled? What are the logistics in paying for the utilities? In other areas with data centers for AI processing, the rising utility costs are passed on to the residents that live around the data centers. The corporations in charge of the data centers do not foot the bill. Instead, they are given discounts while the excessive costs are passed onto the residents. ([See the Hyperion data center in Holly Ridge, LA.](#))
The argument for the data center is that it will bring in millions of dollars to the city of Monterey Park, but will the increased cash flow help mitigate the subsequent rising utility costs for residents? How will these millions be spent? Please provide an itemized list of expenditures and investments for the alleged incoming millions. Will the revenue help maintain the current air and water quality and allow residents to use water normally without drought-like rationing restrictions? Will the revenue help maintain affordable and reasonable electricity, water, and gas bills for the residents? Please do not make residents pay more for the presence of the data center, when the data center project managers will not take responsibility for the rising utility costs. That this situation is acceptable in any business plan is unreasonable.

Data Centers use a massive amount of energy and water, much more than other business or housing developments with the same footprint, and will have a direct impact on utilities for residents. The energy used by the center and pollutants created by the generators will also degrade air quality in the city.

These drawbacks offer little in return for the community. This is not a proposal that introduces new jobs or public goods proportionate to the amount it takes from the community.

Please make sure a full EIR is conducted and the citizens are allowed to speak on this issue before proceeding.

Key reasons for my opposition include:

- The project could increase energy and water demand, raising utility costs for residents.
- Fourteen diesel generators pose air quality, noise, and public health risks.
- The project offers few long-term jobs or community benefits despite heavy resource use.
- Alternative uses such as mixed use, parks, or retail were not seriously considered.
- The community has not been adequately informed, represented, or included in this process.
