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Dear Honorable Mayor Elizabeth Yang & Members of the City Council,

I am writing to you today as a proud resident of Monterey Park for the past five years and a parent raising a young family in this community. This proposal (Item 10.B) is therefore highly concerning to me. Based on documented environmental and public health crises linked to similar facilities across the country, particularly the issues of water contamination and air pollution, I strongly urge the City to immediately place a moratorium on the approval process until a comprehensive and fully transparent review can be completed.

Recent investigative reports, such as the one detailing the crisis in Morrow County, Oregon, have exposed how data centers can exacerbate environmental hazards:

1. **Water Scarcity and Contamination:** Data centers require enormous volumes of water for cooling, a practice that, in water-stressed regions, depletes scarce resources. Furthermore, the evaporative cooling process can concentrate existing pollutants, leading to contaminated wastewater being reintroduced into local systems. Given California's perpetual drought and the density of the San Gabriel Valley, placing such a massive demand on our water infrastructure is an unacceptable risk to the city's water security.
2. **Air Pollution and Public Health:** Data centers rely on large backup diesel generators to maintain continuous operation. The testing and use of these generators release significant emissions of fine particulate matter (PM) and nitrogen oxides (NOx), known respiratory irritants. Placing a facility with these polluting generators in or near our densely populated neighborhoods will worsen local air quality and disproportionately increase the risk of asthma and other respiratory and cardiovascular illnesses for Monterey Park residents.

I respectfully request that the City Council take the following immediate actions:

1. **Enforce a Moratorium:** Halt all planning and approval actions related to the Data Center until a thorough, independent, and publicly accessible review of its environmental and health impacts is completed.
2. **Mandate a Health Impact Assessment (HIA) & Environmental Impact Report (EIR):** Require both the city & developer to fund and submit a comprehensive HIA & EIR performed by an independent third party, specifically modeling the cumulative impacts of water demand and air emissions on local public health.

3. **Demand Complete Transparency:** Reject any claims of "trade secrets" related to resource usage. The developer must publicly disclose the source of all projected water usage, the amount of consumption, and detailed plans for wastewater and air emission mitigation.
4. **Require Sustainable Solutions:** Any future consideration must be contingent on strict mandates for using 100% non-potable or recycled water for cooling and powering the facility entirely with verifiable clean, renewable energy sources, eliminating the reliance on polluting diesel generators.

Monterey Park must prioritize the health and long-term well-being of its residents over rapid commercial development and potential tax incentives that do not offset long-term public costs.

I look forward to the City's commitment to transparency and meaningful public engagement on this critical issue.

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Good evening, I am unable to make it in person tonight. My name is Gustavo Reynoso and I am a 25-year resident of Monterey Park and I have some concerns about the proposed Data centers. Data centers similar to the one I used to run when I was the Director of Web Development for Global Crossing, which owned a subsidiary called GlobalCenter. Global Center managed data centers in Sunnyvale, California, Phoenix, Arizona, Herndon, Virginia, Manhattan and a Network Operations Center in London. My concerns center around the health of our community, including those that can easily be found online and should inform our council before they make any rash, ill-timed decisions. These include:

1. **The Environmental Degradation:** Data centers contribute to greenhouse gas emissions and can lead to air quality issues due to diesel exhaust and other pollutants.
2. **Noise Pollution:** The operational noise from data centers, including HVAC systems and backup diesel generators, can be significant and may disrupt sleep and cause stress.

My name is Kristie Vasquez,

a Monterey Park homeowner and long-time community member. I am submitting this email as a formal objection to Item 10B and the proposed data center.

I am stating this without hesitation: this project is an unacceptable threat to our health, homes, and community, and any attempt to approve it without the fullest, most comprehensive environmental review will be met with immediate and aggressive legal action.

FORMAL LEGAL NOTICE

This email serves as official notice that if the City of Monterey Park approves this project without a complete and legally compliant Environmental Impact Report (EIR), I will initiate a CEQA lawsuit against the City and the developer.

You are now explicitly aware that:

- A Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) is not legally sufficient.
- Noise, air quality, diesel emissions, and cumulative health effects must be fully analyzed.

Public-health risks MUST be studied under CEQA.

- Residential impacts CANNOT be brushed aside.

Any attempt to shortcut CEQA will be considered a direct violation, and I am prepared to respond accordingly.

THE HEALTH RISKS ARE REAL — AND YOU WILL BE ACCOUNTABLE

Data centers across the country have caused:

I am a deeply concerned resident of Monterey Park. I am speaking today not to debate technology, but to forcefully reject this proposal, which is not an economic boon, but a direct and measurable threat to the health, environment, and financial stability of our community.

We are being asked to sacrifice our resources and our health for a project that offers little in return. The evidence, especially within California, is overwhelming.

1. Environmental Devastation: A Vicious Cycle of Resource Theft
This data center represents a massive, non-essential burden on resources that are already scarce in Southern California.

-Water Consumption is Unacceptable: Large data centers use evaporative cooling, consuming water equivalent to thousands of homes daily. A recent report showed that water consumption by data centers in California nearly doubled between 2019 and 2023. In a region that faces chronic drought and water restrictions, we cannot justify giving away our limited water supply to cool rows of computer servers. We must put our residents, schools, and parks first.

-Grid Strain and Energy Demand: California data center

electricity consumption already accounts for a significant and growing portion of the state's total energy demand—equaling the annual consumption of millions of households. Approving this facility will place an unprecedented strain on our local power grid, increasing the risk of rolling blackouts and infrastructure failure for the homes and small businesses that depend on reliable power.

2. Public Health Crisis: Trading Clean Air for Corporate Profit
The most devastating impact will be on the health of our residents, particularly our children and elderly.

-Diesel Generator Poisoning: Data centers rely on massive banks of diesel backup generators for continuous operation. These generators—often the size of a shipping container—are regularly tested and deployed during grid instability. They emit highly toxic air pollutants, including Nitrogen Oxides and fine particulate matter

-Direct Health Costs: Exposure to these pollutants is directly linked by major health organizations to:

- Exacerbated asthma and respiratory illnesses.
- Heart and lung disease.
- Increased cancer risk.
- Cognitive development harm in children.

The Cost to Monterey Park: A recent assessment projected that negative health impacts from data center pollution could add thousands of cases of asthma and millions in health costs to California annually. We are asked to accept these health risks while the corporate operator enjoys the profits.

3. Financial Burden: Higher Bills, No Economic Benefit
Data center developers promise growth, but the economic reality is a net loss for the residential ratepayer.

-Ratepayer Subsidy: Data centers are granted preferential, discounted energy rates. This results in the costs for infrastructure upgrades and increased power demand being shifted directly onto existing residents and small businesses in the form of higher monthly utility bills. We should not be forced to subsidize a highly profitable global corporation's power usage.

-Minimal Job Creation: These facilities are automated boxes. Once built, they typically employ only a handful of highly specialized personnel—far fewer jobs than a local retail center or light industrial site. We are sacrificing valuable land and critical resources for a project that is an economic dud for the average Monterey Park family.

Conclusion: No to the Trojan Horse of Technology

This is not a project that builds community; it is a project that consumes it.

I urge the Planning Commission and the City Council to look past the promises of technology and look squarely at the documented, verifiable impacts across California: poisoned air, stolen water, and increased utility bills.

We are the residents. Our health, our environment, and our water supply must be put first. We urge you to reject this proposal immediately and protect the community of Monterey Park.

How many employees do they expect to hire after the facility is completed?</p> <p>Construction workers are needed to build the facility but how many will be from our immediate community (neighboring cities of MPK: Alhambra, Montebello, Boyle Heights, City of Commerce, Rosemead, San Gabriel, Temple City, South Pasadena, and other cities within 5 miles of the build? Similar to LAX rebuild, they only hired individuals from specific zip codes; if any large companies are taking stake in our community, they</p>

should also have similar requirements so that our community benefit.

The concern for noise, air, and soil pollution is also high. Although the area is currently of mixed-use, the data center will share land next to houses and the topography of the land shows that run off will spill into residential areas. Monterey Park already has issues with flooding and sewage, are we going to add contaminated water of heavy metals to our ongoing list of problems that we are already slow to fix (slow progress is the reality)? What's the released air particulate report look like if there's a data center especially during summers and annual wildfires? I live in District 1 but I'm concerned for residents that live within the immediate area of the proposed data center.

The plot of land that is available is prime real estate for mixed commercial/residential ideas that can benefit our community long term. Monterey Park is currently known for tea shops, dumplings, and dim sum. Everything else within our city is for our residents. Alhambra is our cooler sister because they're known for more than boba and Pasadena is our bougie cousin--they both have more out of area visitors than our city; for decades, everyone outside of SGV have declared their love for Alhambra and Pasadena. FYI, MPK is now known for boba, dim sum and the mass shooting; younger generations don't look into MPK for anything else (I have Gen Z friends). And now you want to add a data center to our identity? I believe that will nail the coffin to MPK's image and identity for the next 30-50 years--one that we won't be able to fix or improve in the near future. I pass by this land multiple times a week and I have high expectations for this plot of land for years. Please city council, think out of the box for long term rewards and profits, not short term gratification. MPK needs an image revamp and this is not the way. Many cities in the area are creating regional community centers/parks but we choose data centers. Even our legendary Barnes Park Pool is dead.

If city council decides to move forward with this monstrosity, I would hope city council will also provide public data on future usage of the data center so that we can independently verify this data. Utilities (electricity and water) continue to rise, so it's easy to deduce that the data center will increase our electricity and water costs as well as increasing our likelihood of brown outs. This year alone, we experienced brown outs that affected my area more than 10 times possibly due to over usage and/or Edison equipment failure (on average 4 hours (some were 2, others were longer than 6)). We have been having more brown outs compared to the past. How will a data center that will use more power than our city affect our power grid? Will we have to endure more and longer brown outs? So many businesses had

to shut their doors and call it a loss for the day because they couldn't charge or fulfill their patrons' orders.

This is a big project that shouldn't rely solely on our councilmembers to decide the fate of our city's future; similar to the non action on our Barnes Park Pool. Due to the postponement of the voting, please use the time to poll your constituents in your districts to see how everyone feels about the project.

All this for the sake of a wealthy foreign company's database is unfair towards the people that will continue to live around this database. This land could be repurposed in a more productive</p>

way. We were still experiencing heat waves in November. We don't need these databases in our backyards, they are of no benefit to the community.

There is also a great conflict of interest regarding councilmember Wong who is employed by Southern California Edison while simultaneously being a part of the Saturn Park Advisory Review, who I believe did not do efficient community outreach on this database project. It is unfair to lead residents to believe that they will not foot the cost of higher usage of the electricity used for the private company's datacenter by simply claiming that this datacenter will bring in revenue to Monterey Park. Yes, that revenue will come from the residents who will be forcibly responsible for paying a higher electricity and water bill. It is also unfair that someone who is employed by the company that would benefit from these rising costs is also working with private foreign companies to build their datacenters in the community without regard to its residents.

I believe many families with children would want to be aware of a 14-diesel-powered, water consuming database center next to La Loma Park. The dangers of the water consumption come from the datacenters needing to be cooled down, and in a state that is known to be hotter and sunnier than others, it is unfair to lead residents to believe that a 14-diesel-powered data center will be sustainable. That is just not true based on data from communities that already live near a datacenter. Water pressure decreases in homes and the water has been described to become brownish and murky because of these datacenters' water usage.

The bare minimum is that we demand a full Environmental Impact report and not just a Mitigated Negative Declaration.

Main Key reasons for my opposition include:

The project could increase energy and water demand, raising utility costs for residents.

Fourteen diesel generators pose air quality, noise, and public health risks.

The project offers few long-term jobs or community benefits despite heavy resource use.

Alternative uses such as mixed use, parks, or retail were not seriously considered.

The community has not been adequately informed, represented, or included in this process.

Conflict of interest regarding council members being employed by a company that would benefit from increased electricity bills.

Please slow down this process, require a full EIR, and prioritize the needs and well-being of Monterey Park residents over a

project that could burden our neighborhoods for decades.

Written Communication Dear Honorable Mayor Elizabeth Yang & Members of the City Council,

I am writing to you today as a proud resident of Monterey Park for the past five years and a parent raising a young family in this community. This proposal (Item 10.B) is therefore highly concerning to me. Based on documented environmental and public health crises linked to similar facilities across the country, particularly the issues of water contamination and air pollution, I strongly urge the City to immediately place a moratorium on the approval process until a comprehensive and fully transparent review can be completed.

Recent investigative reports, such as the one detailing the crisis in Morrow County, Oregon, have exposed how data centers can exacerbate environmental hazards:

Water Scarcity and Contamination: Data centers require enormous volumes of water for cooling, a practice that, in water-stressed regions, depletes scarce resources. Furthermore, the evaporative cooling process can concentrate existing pollutants, leading to contaminated wastewater being reintroduced into local systems. Given California's perpetual drought and the density of the San Gabriel Valley, placing such a massive demand on our

water infrastructure is an unacceptable risk to the city's water security.

Air Pollution and Public Health: Data centers rely on large backup diesel generators to maintain continuous operation. The testing and use of these generators release significant emissions of fine particulate matter (PM) and nitrogen oxides (NOx), known respiratory irritants. Placing a facility with these polluting generators in or near our densely populated neighborhoods will worsen local air quality and disproportionately increase the risk of asthma and other respiratory and cardiovascular illnesses for Monterey Park residents.

I respectfully request that the City Council take the following immediate actions:

Enforce a Moratorium: Halt all planning and approval actions related to the Data Center until a thorough, independent, and publicly accessible review of its environmental and health impacts is completed.

Mandate a Health Impact Assessment (HIA) & Environmental Impact Report (EIR): Require both the city & developer to fund and submit a comprehensive HIA & EIR performed by an independent third party, specifically modeling the cumulative impacts of water demand and air emissions on local public health.

Demand Complete Transparency: Reject any claims of "trade secrets" related to resource usage. The developer must publicly disclose the source of all projected water usage, the amount of consumption, and detailed plans for wastewater and air emission mitigation.

Require Sustainable Solutions: Any future consideration must be contingent on strict mandates for using 100% non-potable or recycled water for cooling and powering the facility entirely with verifiable clean, renewable energy sources, eliminating the reliance on polluting diesel generators.

Monterey Park must prioritize the health and long-term well-being of its residents over rapid commercial development and potential tax incentives that do not offset long-term public costs.

I look forward to the City's commitment to transparency and meaningful public engagement on this critical issue.

Air-quality and public-health impact. The project is expected to rely on diesel generators which emit diesel particulate matter (DPM) and other pollutants that can worsen respiratory conditions. Using an MND underestimates the long-term health risks for residents, especially children, seniors, and those with asthma or other vulnerabilities. 2. Noise, disruption, and community impact. The site is adjacent to a community park and residential areas. Construction and ongoing operations (generators, cooling equipment, increased traffic) will likely raise ambient noise levels, reduce quality of life, and disturb nearby residents and park users. 3. Excessive energy consumption. If as reported per the article from coloradoboulevard.net, the data center's energy use would approach or exceed 1.7 times the city's current total energy

usage, this creates a substantial energy-impact concern. Under CEQA, energy use is one of the categories that may trigger the need for an EIR.

4. Lack of transparency and insufficient disclosure. The MND process does not require the same level of comprehensive analysis, alternatives evaluation, or public accountability as an EIR. Under CEQA, an EIR is required when there is substantial evidence that a project “may” have a significant environmental impact or when a fair argument can be made that significant impacts may occur.

5. Lack of alternatives analysis. A full EIR would permit evaluation of feasible alternatives, including “no project,” smaller-scale facilities, different locations less sensitive to air/noise/energy impacts, or architectures that would reduce diesel-generator dependency (e.g., fully electric or renewable-powered). An MND does not typically include a robust alternatives analysis.

What we are asking:

- That the Council direct the lead agency to prepare a full EIR so the community receives complete disclosure of all potential environmental, health, and energy impacts.
- That the EIR must include a meaningful alternatives analysis, including a “no project” scenario and potentially lower-impact alternatives (e.g., smaller data-center footprint, alternative site, renewable-power only, no diesel generators, or fully electric operation).
- That any mitigation plan must include concrete, enforceable requirements (e.g., air-pollution controls, noise limits, energy-use reduction measures, continuous monitoring, community notification if emergency generator use is needed, and a community benefit/offset program if pollution or energy draws are unavoidable).

As residents of Monterey Park, we deserve a full, transparent, and responsible environmental review which protects our health, environment, and long-term quality of life. We ask the City Council to pause approval and require a full EIR.

Incompatibility With Surrounding Neighborhoods Monterey Park is a residential community with schools, families, and small businesses. A high-intensity industrial facility—such as a data center—does not align with the character, needs, or long-term vision of our city. Introducing a large-scale industrial operation in close proximity to homes raises concerns about property value impacts, increased traffic, and disruptions caused by 24/7 operations.</p>

3. Limited Community Benefit

Data centers are known for providing minimal permanent jobs relative to their footprint and environmental impact. The economic benefit to local residents is therefore limited, while the risks—resource consumption, noise, heat output, and potential hazards—are felt directly by the community. Monterey Park should prioritize developments that create meaningful employment opportunities and provide services or amenities that residents can actually use.

4. Long-Term Sustainability Concerns

As cities across California move toward sustainability and environmentally conscious planning, approving a resource-intensive data center moves Monterey Park in the opposite direction. A development of this scale should be thoroughly evaluated for long-term environmental costs rather than short-term financial gains. Once approved, the city would be locked into the consequences for decades.

Conclusion

For these reasons, I respectfully urge the City Council to reject the proposed data center project. Monterey Park deserves developments that enhance our community, support local families, and protect our environmental future. A data center does not meet those standards.

As a homeowner and business owner in Monterey Park, I am writing to oppose the proposed data-center development at 1977 Saturn Street in Monterey Park. I urge the Council to deny or pause this project until a full, independent environmental and public-health review is completed due to the following concerns:

1. 24/7 noise with documented health effects

Data centers generate continuous low-frequency noise from cooling equipment, plus loud diesel-generator tests. Studies link this type of noise exposure to sleep disturbance, stress, impaired cognition, and increased cardiovascular risk. Even when technically “within limits,” residents in multiple cities report chronic quality-of-life impacts.

2. Diesel generator emissions affecting local air quality

Backup generators release fine-particle pollution (PM2.5) and NO₂. These pollutants are tied to respiratory and cardiovascular harm, and several states now warn that generator clusters at data centers pose localized air-quality risks. Regular testing can expose residents even when the grid is functioning.

3. High water usage that strains community supply

Large data centers can consume millions of gallons of water per day for cooling. In drought-prone areas, this demand can stress municipal supplies and complicate long-term water planning. Independent reviews warn that data-center growth is outpacing water-resource capacity in several regions.

4. Significant grid impacts with limited local benefit

Data centers require major electrical-infrastructure upgrades that can increase costs for ratepayers. Despite their scale, long-term job creation is typically low relative to land, water, and infrastructure impacts. Multiple cities have delayed or rejected similar projects for this reason.

5. Growing national concern and regulatory caution

Across the U.S., councils are pausing or strengthening oversight of data-center proposals due to these documented harms. Experts recommend setbacks from homes, stricter noise standards, generator-emission limits, transparent water reporting, and binding community-benefit agreements.

Requested actions

- Deny or pause approval pending an independent environmental and health impact study.
- Require strict noise limits (including low-frequency noise), limits on generator testing, and verified water-use mitigation.

- Require a binding community-benefits agreement and transparent monitoring plans before any approval is considered.

The research is clear: without strong oversight and safeguards, these facilities can degrade quality of life and strain essential resources. I urge the Council to prioritize community health and infrastructure resilience by withholding approval until the necessary analyses are complete.

3. Hold a public hearing or town hall meeting to allow open dialogue, questions, and community participation. These public hearings should have adequate notice to residents which includes notifying in the local Cascades newspaper, flyers, city hall announcements, social media announcements.
4. Commission an independent third-party environmental and infrastructure review, with full public availability of the results.

I'm submitting public comment on Item 10B. I strongly oppose the proposed data center at 1977 Saturn Avenue and strongly urge the Council to require a full Environmental Impact Report (EIR) before any vote. A Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) is inadequate, exposing residents to potential risks without any awareness, any documented plans to address them, and any one to hold accountable. We cannot begin a project with the assumption that impacts are not significant. It is a disservice to Monterey Park, the entire San Gabriel Valley, and all communities beyond our city limits. We deserve transparency and deserve to know all identified risks and the plans to address them. We deserve to know how this project will impact our life in the short and long term and the opportunity to have our concerns heard. Private development still impacts public health, energy infrastructure, and long-term sustainability in Monterey Park and affects every single resident.

A major project of this size with direct and indirect community impact needs transparency, public input, and community trust. Many residents only learned about this project days before the vote. This is not meaningful engagement and does not allow residents the opportunity to engage with other community members and gather more information on the project to make educated contributions to the discourse. Furthermore, Monterey Park is a diverse community with residents whose primary language may be something other than English. Given the limited to no communication on this project, I'm skeptical residents received this information in their primary language. Minimal community engagement and input is even more concerning with the knowledge that 2 of the 9 Saturn Park Advisory Review Committee (SPARC) members are council members, and several others are closely tied to the council. Additionally, there are blatant conflicts of interest with one councilmember being currently employed by Southern California Edison, the stakeholder that stands to significantly benefit from the project's massive power demand. Recusing himself only at the final vote does not negate his participation and influence in the process leading up to the vote. The SPARC process raises concerns about representation and conflicts of interest. Alternatives were not seriously considered. Lack of independent fiscal analysis is also concerning, especially when estimated dollar amounts come from the developer, not the city.

The project would triple the city's energy use and introduce 24 diesel generators. The City has not disclosed testing schedules, emissions controls, or monitoring plans. Noise exemptions do not cover routine testing, and nearby homes and parks will be affected. Monterey Park residents already feel the burden of climate change. We know it is getting hotter and rain storms, wildfires, and droughts are becoming more intense. There is documented evidence from other communities (one example is Mansfield, Georgia) of the environmental impact from data centers. Some residents in Mansfield are less than 400 yards away from the Meta data center and residents can see sediment in their water and suffer from light and noise

pollution at all hours of the day. Data centers place extraordinary demand on power grids, putting residents at risk of increased energy bills and black outs as current energy infrastructure is expected to support extraordinary needs. The proposed data center in Monterey Park will triple the city's electricity use and relies on diesel generators. Data centers are not low-impact and generate substantial greenhouse gases when powered by fossil-heavy regional grids. The pocket park and trail deposit do not offset long-term impacts. There is no maintenance plan or community design process. Fiscal claims lack detail and should be independently reviewed. Monterey Park has better options for economic development that generate more jobs, more local spending, and fewer environmental risks than a massive data center.

The proposal to build a data center in Monterey Park, an immigrant and working-class community of color with predominantly Asian (65.6%) and Hispanic (28.5%) residents, is deeply troubling. Environmental racism is a well known and documented public health issue, affecting communities primarily populated by African Americans, Latines, Indigenous People, Asian Americans, low-income workers, and migrant farmworkers and disproportionately exposes these groups to toxic fumes, ash, soot, and other pollutants. As a result, these groups face increased risks of health problems like cancer and respiratory issues. The proposal of this data center in Monterey Park is a public health concern, with the risk of severe health impacts, and could be viewed as a form of environmental racism. Why Monterey Park, CA and not Palo Alto, CA, Menlo Park, CA, or San Clemente, CA or other cities that are not predominantly immigrant, working-class and people of color?

Monterey Park residents at the individual level and community level will bear the weight of these public health and environmental impacts. It is the city's responsibility to protect its residents, weigh the real risks that fall on residents, and ensure that our interests, health, and quality of life are put above corporate and private interests.

My Concerns:

My main concern is that the city of Monterey Park needs more due diligence on the impact it will have on our community and we need more transparency from SCE and HMC Capital/DigiCo REIT.

- **Environmental Impact Report** needs to be completed to understand what impact a data center will have on our air, noise, water, climate, and wildlife. If one has been completed, may I have a copy? I also don't know how well an EIR would even be accurate considering we don't know what type of processing will be done at the facility.

- **What kind of data center?** This is where transparency is important. Cloud computing, AI, crypto mining, data storage, etc all require vastly different amounts of energy usage, and we should know what processes will be done here. On their website, DigiCo REIT advertise "Bespoke Builds," (<https://www.digi-co.com.au/our-solutions/>) meaning it could be anything from the most mundane storage tasks to the most high energy usage of mining or AI processing. What assurances do we have that the amount of power required for this facility won't shift as the companies that lease these servers change? Also, where can I find HMC Capital/DigiCo's application?

• **SCE and HMC Capital/DigiCo REIT Contract Transparency.** In just about every instance I've seen around the country, data centers make deals with local energy companies for large Power Purchase Agreements that the energy company then offsets the costs onto the community. This would of course affect operations of our local government, schools, small business, and citizens. Do we have access to any contracts made between SCE and HMC Capital/DigiCo REIT?

• **This year California passed SB57** which is meant to assess whether a power company is cost shifting the costs of data centers onto the community.

I think it's a step in the right direction but doesn't actually protect the community from cost shifts and is quite vague in implementation. Monterey Park should codify safeguards, audits, regulations, and overall accountability on SCE and HMC Capital/DigiCo REIT.

• **MPK has a climate action plan and data centers will set it back**

Unfortunately, most data center companies will promise an effort to develop or replace its use of fossil fuels with renewable energy, but because of the size and the need for continued reliability, it is currently impossible for data centers to go completely off of fossil fuels. There are currently no viable renewable energy sources powerful enough to keep up with demand, and renewable energy is not growing at pace with data centers. In many cases, this promise either altogether abandoned and new fossil fuel power plants are commissioned to keep up demand, or it remains a promise to be fulfilled at some vague future date. (the research paper above goes in to much more detail)

• **Other concerns.** I worry how it will affect our schools, small businesses, families, library, public works, police dept, fire dept, and on and on. And unfortunately, because data centers require a city to redo infrastructure to accommodate it's power and water usage, if it doesn't work out, we're stuck footing the bill for something that's too big too fail.

How do I get information about the townhalls that will be happening? Are we getting nonpartisan experts to also address community concerns? It'd be great to get experts who study the affects of data centers on local communities.

Final Thoughts

I am not completely opposed to data centers because I understand they keep us connected, allow me to write this email, and do all of this research among other things. Data centers cause environmental and economic harm to surrounding communities, including:

- Raising our electricity rates due to increased demand
- Increasing the risk for blackouts due to strain on the electrical grid
- Straining water supply in a region regularly impacted by drought
- Increasing air pollution and cancer risk due to regular operation of diesel generators
- Increasing noise pollution due to 24/7 operation of computer servers

While the area was rezoned to spur development, the community deserves developments that actually serve residents, like mixed-use developments that include shopping and housing.

I urge you to consider what future Monterey Park residents will benefit from most, and whether that vision should include data centers that will do untold harm to the local environment, economy, and the health of residents.
