I am expressing deep dissatisfaction with Item 10.A on the Agenda Packet for today's (Dec 3, 2025) council hearing regarding the approval for a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) as opposed to a full Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the proposed HMC Capital Data Center project on 1977 Saturn Avenue.

This project would have a significant impact on local, regional, and global environments, public health, and public well being. The data center would rely on massive energy consumption that does not align with the state's climate goals, would increase energy prices for local residents, would not provide long-term community benefits, and would harm local air quality.

There is much state-wide and national data to support my claim, and the project would need an adequate EIR to scope out the potential impacts of this project and propose adequate alternatives. I also express concern about the potential conflict of interest regarding Councilmember Wong's role in the SPARC that was meant to represent broad community representation.

This matter requires more community outreach and a proper EIR. It does not align with the intentions of Prop 4 that calls for CEQA exemptions in cases where projects provide net benefit to water, air, and open spaces. This project does NOT qualify.

Dear Council Members,

As a 37-year resident of Monterey Park, I write to share my perspective on the proposed data center at 1977 Saturn Street, rooted in my deep connection to this community. My family and I have lived, worked, and raised children here, and I've witnessed the evolution of our city firsthand. The proposed site holds personal significance: it lies along my daily running route, a connector between neighborhoods, and I spent 18 years working at this location with the organization that previously occupied the site, followed by 4 years across the street at the old Union Bank building. This area is not just an address—it's part of our community's fabric.

Key Concerns and Observations

1. Community Engagement and Transparency

- I share responsibility for not being more actively engaged in local governance, despite staying informed via email newsletters and Cascades. Many residents, like me, juggle work, family, and other obligations, yet this proposal underscores the need for clearer communication channels and broader public involvement.
- The absence of a completed **Environmental Impact Report (EIR)** raises

concerns about due diligence. As a professional, I know complex decisions require rigorous analysis. Rushing this process risks overlooking critical environmental, health, or quality-of-life impacts.

2. Overwhelming Community Opposition

- At the December 3 council meeting, I observed no speakers supporting the proposal after the announcement for deferral to January. The lone pro-proposal voice (a construction worker's interview on CBS News citing jobs) reflected a short-term view, unaligned with residents who will bear long-term consequences.
- The 1977 Saturn Street building has long suffered from maintenance issues. Modernizing it for mixed-use development (e.g., housing, retail, or green space) would better serve our community than a data center, which prioritizes corporate interests over local needs.

3. Request for Council Insights

- I urge you to address the following transparently:
 - **Short-term benefits:** Beyond temporary construction jobs, what immediate gains (e.g., revenue, infrastructure upgrades) does this proposal offer?
 - **Long-term trade-offs:** How will the city mitigate risks like increased energy/water demand, noise, or reduced property values? What safeguards exist to ensure community well-being?
 - **Alternatives:** Have other land uses been explored that align with Monterey Park's character and sustainability goals?

A Plea for Balance

While economic growth is vital, this proposal must align with our city's values. The proposed site's strategic location presents an opportunity that should enhance, not encumber, Monterey Park's character. I implore you to weigh the irreversible impacts on our neighborhoods, environment, and residents' daily lives. Let's prioritize solutions that honor Monterey Park's past while building a resilient, inclusive future.

Thank you for your dedication to our community and for considering my thoughts on the data center proposal. I appreciate the opportunity to engage in this discussion and look forward to continuing the conversation at upcoming community events, where I hope to meet each of you and explore ways to address the concerns and needs of our city together.

I write as a local real estate professional with experience evaluating commercial property use, valuation, and neighborhood impacts in Monterey Park and the greater San Gabriel Valley.

From a community and land-use perspective, the proposed data center at 1977 Saturn Street represents a significant private reinvestment in an established industrial area. Based on conservative industry benchmarks, the proposed data center represents approximately a \$600 million private investment that would keep the property on the tax rolls and generate ongoing public revenue to help fund core city services such as police and fire protection, street maintenance, parks, libraries, and other quality-of-life services relied upon by residents.

I recognize and respect the concerns raised by residents regarding environmental and operational impacts. For that reason, I support the applicant's willingness to complete a full Environmental Impact Report (EIR). The EIR process provides transparency, meaningful public participation, and enforceable mitigation measures, ensuring that potential impacts—such as noise, generator operations, construction activity, and lighting—are fully analyzed and addressed before any final approvals.

I respectfully urge caution regarding the proposed moratorium. In commercial real estate markets, prolonged uncertainty surrounding an active application often changes the future of a property in unintended ways. Across Los Angeles County, prolonged regulatory uncertainty has led private commercial and hotel properties to be acquired by public agencies for interim or permanent homeless or supportive housing uses, which typically removes those properties from the tax rolls and shifts long-term operating and service costs to the public sector. While such programs may be appropriate in certain locations, once a site transitions to public ownership, higher-value private reinvestment options are effectively foreclosed.

The decision before the City is therefore not simply whether to pause or proceed with this project, but whether Monterey Park maintains local control over a revenue-generating land use that supports community services, or risks a permanent shift to a non-taxable public use due to delay and uncertainty.

For these reasons, I respectfully encourage a balanced “yes, if” approach: • Yes,

allow the application to proceed under existing rules.

- Yes, require a full EIR with meaningful public input.
- Yes, impose clear and enforceable conditions addressing noise, generator testing and emissions, construction impacts, lighting, and ongoing monitoring and compliance.

This approach protects neighborhood quality of life, ensures transparency and accountability, and safeguards the City's long-term fiscal and land-use interests.

The City's presentation of over 1,700 pages of public agency comments, extensive concerns, and responses in October 2025 constitutes significant new information. California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documents must be recirculated for public review when new information is presented to allow the public and the agencies time to review and comment.

A Negative Declaration is not the proper CEQA document for this project as Neg Decs are only allowed for projects which have NO significant environmental impacts.

This project has the potential for numerous significant environmental impacts including, but not limited to: air quality emissions, human health risk impacts, greenhouse gas emissions, significant water usage (1,200,000 gallons per year), hazardous material storage (over 150,000 gallons of diesel), electricity demand of nearly 438,000,000 KWh/year (equivalent of approx. 38,000 homes), and harmful noise impacts from the generators. In order to properly and legally evaluate all potential impacts, a full Environmental Impact Report (EIR) should be prepared for this project.

Agency experts submitted comment letter back in 2024 on this project.

Specifically, SCAQMD's December 3, 2024 comment letter indicates that this project could result in cancer risk of up to 1,876 cases in one million residents when the health standard is 10 in one million. [page 3].

Sensitive receptors are located as close as 65 feet from the proposed diesel generators. Has SCAQMD confirmed that any revised calculations have been done correctly? This impact alone requires an EIR. “

Greenhouse gas emissions from the project, estimated by the applicant at 85,309 metric tonnes per year, is significantly over the SCAQMD Annual Threshold for GHGs of 10,000 tons per year. This impact alone requires an EIR.

Fresh water demand of over 1,200,000 gallons of water for this facility is a significant and unavoidable impact that requires analysis in an EIR.

Deborah Jue, a noise expert, raised serious concerns about generator noise to the surrounding community. Have her concerns been addressed? An EIR would be needed to do so.

Therefore, we urge the Monterey Park City Council to delay on your vote on this project as its potentially significant adverse environmental impacts have not been sufficiently studied and shared with the public as required by CEQA. The City cannot legally approve this document without full, proper public disclosure of all potential environmental impacts.

- * The project offers very few long-term jobs or community benefits despite heavy resource use.
- * Alternative uses such as mixed use, parks, or retail were not seriously considered.
- * The community has not been adequately informed, represented, or included in this process.

I urge you to recognize the severity of the situation. I have worked with San Gabriel Valley city council members and am fully aware of the impact and care they have for their community. This city has prospered for decades, providing a home for Asian and Latino diasporas. We, as residents, deserve to have the situation meaningfully reviewed over a rushed approval. Thousands of families rely on Monterey Park to allow the current generation to prosper and build future generations, and the city cannot take a passive stance and let the consequences play out. Please slow down this process, require a full EIR, and prioritize the needs and well-being of Monterey Park residents over a project that would burden our neighborhoods for decades.

Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council,

I write to respectfully summarize a balanced path forward regarding the Saturn Street data center that protects Monterey Park's fiscal interests, advances transparency, and minimizes legal risk, while remaining fair to the current applicant and responsive to community concerns.

First, I appreciate the Council's focus on both economic development and climate responsibility. The proposed data center does offer potential tax revenue through property and utility taxes, but it also raises legitimate questions about long-term environmental impacts. In that context, the Council's request for a full Environmental Impact Report (EIR) is appropriate and prudent. An EIR will provide the comprehensive analysis needed to inform sound decision-making and strengthen the City's administrative record.

Importantly, the applicant has indicated a willingness to proceed with a full EIR. That commitment reflects good-faith cooperation and should be acknowledged on the record. Proceeding with a full EIR directly addresses calls for greater environmental review without foreclosing the Council's authority to impose robust conditions or, if warranted, deny the project based on the evidence.

I respectfully urge the Council to distinguish between two separate actions now under discussion:

- (1) requesting additional environmental information through a full EIR, and
- (2) imposing a 45-day moratorium that would affect a project already in process.

A moratorium is a significant policy tool typically used when there is an immediate rush of applications or a demonstrated loss of regulatory control. Applying a moratorium to a single, pending application—particularly one that has agreed to expanded environmental review—raises concerns of fairness and may introduce avoidable legal risk.

Legal Risk Considerations (Summary):

- Imposing a moratorium mid-process can be characterized as changing the rules after an application has been filed, increasing exposure to claims of unfair treatment or vested rights arguments.
- Allowing the EIR to proceed under existing rules strengthens the

City's CEQA posture by demonstrating reasoned decision-making, good faith, and reliance on evidence rather than procedural barriers.

- Separating the current application from any broader, forward-looking policy study reduces the risk that the City's actions could be viewed as targeted or pretextual.

A constructive alternative is to continue the project, require completion of the full EIR, and concurrently direct staff to study whether additional policies or standards for future data center applications are warranted. This approach preserves Council authority, maintains leverage over the current project through enforceable conditions, and avoids penalizing an applicant who has agreed to enhanced review.

In short, Monterey Park does not need to choose between revenue, climate goals, and fair process. By proceeding with the EIR and deferring any moratorium to future applications, the Council can protect the City legally, maintain public trust, and ensure that any ultimate decision rests on a strong and defensible record.

I'm writing to express my opposition to the proposed data center at 1977 Saturn, as well as my disappointment in how the city has conducted itself throughout this process, which I would characterize as completely lacking transparency, and with a failure to protect community well-being and lack of foresight.</p> <p>Most residents did not know about this project until December, at the last milestone before approval. And the community only found out about it due to grassroots efforts from residents and neighbors to spread awareness -- not due to any effort from the city. This is a major failure on the city's part to adequately bring the community into the process, and a betrayal of public trust. The city has done the bare minimum in public outreach (e.g., fliers for SPARC only sent out to homes within 500 feet of the site), making critical decisions and approvals without widespread community input.</p> <p>I have now heard about multiple council members claiming that there is "misinformation" spreading about the project to try and discount the strong opposition from the community.</p>

To be very clear, there is no misinformation. The community fully understands the few short-term benefits this project would provide, as well as the many short and long term costs and consequences. The opposition you're hearing is telling you that the costs -- to our health, the environment, the community's quality of life, and literal utility costs -- don't justify the measly benefits. By HMC's own estimates, there are only a few specific benefits. However, these are not truly beneficial for MPK residents:

- Tax revenue: Estimated to be \$5 million annually, but this is only 3% of MPK's current budget. (In comparison, SoCal Edison stands to earn \$18 million annually from this project.) MPK is a prime location that could attract lots of developer attention, and we deserve responsible development that truly serves the community. I have no doubt we could generate as much, if not more, tax revenue from projects that are aligned with our vision for MPK.

- Job creation: The data center will only have 26 permanent jobs after construction is complete. There are no long term local employment benefits from this project. And as for short term construction jobs, an economic analysis on data centers in Texas shows that data center construction jobs were transferred jobs, not new or additional jobs -- so this is not a true benefit either. - Modernization: While data centers are modern, they are more similar to heavy industrial facilities like manufacturing plants, which are actually prohibited based on current city zoning. Written Communication My name is Rene Whitfield and I am submitting this comment to express strong opposition to the proposed data center in Monterey Park. Residents were not meaningfully informed about this project despite its massive scale and potential consequences. The limited information that has surfaced raises serious concerns about environmental impacts, community disruption, and the overall lack of transparency in the approval process.

The project's enormous energy and water demands would place significant strain on local resources, while 24/7 industrial noise, increased traffic, and heavy equipment would degrade the quality of life for nearby neighborhoods. These issues should have been disclosed and discussed publicly long before any approvals were considered.

There is also a serious ethical issue that must be addressed. Councilmember Thomas Wong is currently employed by Southern California Edison, the same corporation involved in this data center project. This presents a clear conflict of interest. When an elected official stands to benefit professionally or financially from a corporation whose project he is positioned to influence, it raises legitimate concerns about corruption, divided loyalties, and decisions being made for corporate gain rather

than the public good.

Residents deserve assurance that their representatives are acting solely in their best interest, not in the interest of a powerful utility company. At minimum, Councilmember Wong should recuse himself from all discussions and votes related to this project. Anything less undermines the integrity of the City Council and the democratic process.

This project is being pushed forward without transparency, without community consent, and without adequate environmental review. It threatens our resources, our neighborhoods, and our trust in local government. Monterey Park residents deserve better.

I urge the City Council to:

Pause all approvals related to this data center
Conduct a full environmental impact review
Hold accessible, well-publicized community hearings
Address the conflict-of-interest concerns openly and formally
Prioritize the health, safety, and well-being of residents over corporate interests

My name is Kimberly Tsu, and I am an El Monte resident. I have family who currently reside in Monterey Park and I frequent this area often.

I am writing against the implementation of a data center within the community, affecting residents financially, physically, and emotionally. Historically, POC neighborhoods are subjected to oppressive policies and development of such projects, further insinuating systematic racism. As you may or may not be aware, residents are at a risk of harming their physical and mental health due to the environmental implications that exacerbates risk of inducing health conditions POC are at a higher risk for. Asian Americans are not immune to developing cancer, asthma complications, and other chronic illnesses that harm the well-being of this demographic that makes up Monterey Park. As a social worker with experience working with vulnerable communities, I can tell you that this will develop a mistrust in its own city leaders if this passes and the cycle of systematic oppression continue to benefit the wealthy, putting community members at a financial loss in order to compensate for the power needed to power the data center.

I hope those reading this can understand the irony of honoring the victims of the Monterey Park shooting to "heal community trauma," but retraumatizing its residents immediately after with more oppressive policies that do not benefit the wellbeing of the community. There is no benefit to passing a data center if they only provide just 26 job positions. The environmental concerns are already spoken about at length: power supply, the amount of water needed, and offsetting financial costs by passing it along residents. Reconsider the positionality and power council members hold in regards to this contentious topic. The amount of people who came out to speak out against this development is enough to tell you how this can affect the greater SGV area.

I am writing to express my continued opposition to the proposed data center at 1977 Saturn Street.

In communities across the country, we have seen that data centers suck up a vast amount of energy and water, pollute and restrict access to clean water, and raise utility costs for residents while simultaneously making neighborhoods harder to live in. With current technology, there is [no realistic way](#) to operate an environmentally friendly data center, regardless of planned mitigation strategies.

This proposed data center would operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and use two times the electricity that the entire city uses now. This will inevitably strain our electrical grid, increasing the potential for outages, particularly during high-demand periods (like heat waves). If SoCal Edison needs to upgrade infrastructure to meet the energy demands of the data center, for example by building a new substation, the cost of those upgrades will [likely be passed off to its customers](#)—not just in Monterey Park, but [across southern California](#).

It is unclear what the ongoing water consumption of the data center would be, or what treatment wastewater will receive before it is released back into the water supply. Unless clear measures are put in place to limit water consumption and require wastewater treatment and purification, we run the risk of [losing access to clean water](#).

Emissions from data center construction alone will exceed the thresholds for safety set by the South Coast Air Quality Management District, posing significant health risks and negatively impacting air quality. [Continuing emissions from data center operation](#) may also create [ongoing risks of respiratory diseases \(or exacerbate existing respiratory issues\) and other health problems](#).

Data center operations also cause noise pollution, emitting a constant, low-frequency hum and vibration at levels that [drown out birdsong](#) and [can cause insomnia, impact the nervous system, and otherwise harm physical and mental health](#).

The projected tax revenue from the data center is only a fraction of the City's budget.
Please do not rush to approve such a harmful project that brings such minuscule benefits.
The residents of Monterey Park are counting on you all.
