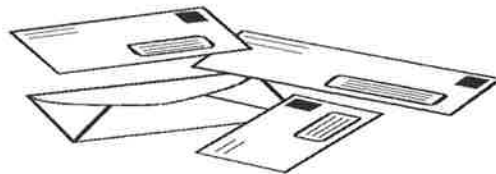

To apply for a **MAIL BALLOT**, fill in the Application Form on the back page of this Voter Information Pamphlet and mail it to the City Clerk by the deadline stated on the form itself. If you are a Permanent Absent Voter, you do not need to return an Application, a Mail Ballot will be automatically mailed to you.



INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS:

PLACE THE BALLOT CARD SO THAT IT LIES COMPLETELY FLAT IN THE BALLOT CARD TRAY. To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, PUNCH OUT THE CROSS (+) in the voting square to the right of the candidate's name. Where two or more candidates for the same office are to be elected, PUNCH OUT THE CROSS (+) after the names of all candidates for the office for whom you desire to vote, not to exceed, however, the number of candidates to be elected.

To vote for a qualified WRITE-IN candidate, write the person's name in the blank space provided for that purpose after the names of the other candidates for the same office and BE SURE TO PUNCH OUT THE CROSS (+) to the right of the name you have written in, or your vote will not be counted.

To vote on any measure, PUNCH OUT THE CROSS (+) in the voting square after the word "YES" or after the word "NO".

All distinguishing marks (except names for qualified write-in candidates) or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void. If you wrongly punch, tear or deface any portion of your ballot card, replace the card in the ballot envelope, return it to the Precinct Board Member and obtain another set.

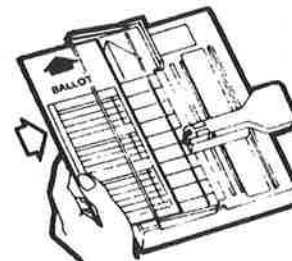
MAKE SURE YOU VOTE BOTH SIDES OF YOUR BALLOT CARD IF THERE ARE OFFICES ON THE BACK SIDE.

AFTER YOU HAVE COMPLETED VOTING, place your ballot card in the ballot envelope with the NUMBERED STUBS AT THE TOP and hand it to the Precinct Board Member who shall, in the presence of the voter, remove the numbered stubs, hand same to voter and deposit the voted ballot in the ballot box.

HOW TO VOTE YOUR BALLOT CARD

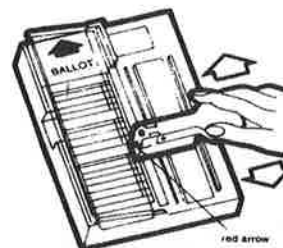
STEP 1

Slip ballot all the way into tray (UNDER clear plastic cover if there is one) from left side of machine.



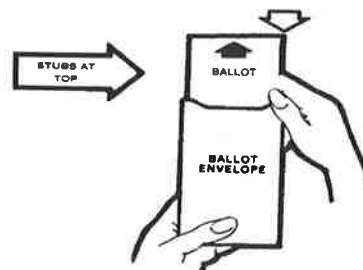
STEP 2

Move the punch lever with its red pointer to the right of the candidate or measure of your choice and completely depress the lever which will punch out the cross (+). Repeat the process until you have voted for all candidates or measures of your choice.



STEP 3

After you have completed voting, return the punch lever to the top position. Place your ballot card with the stub at the top, in the ballot envelope and hand it to the Precinct Board Member.

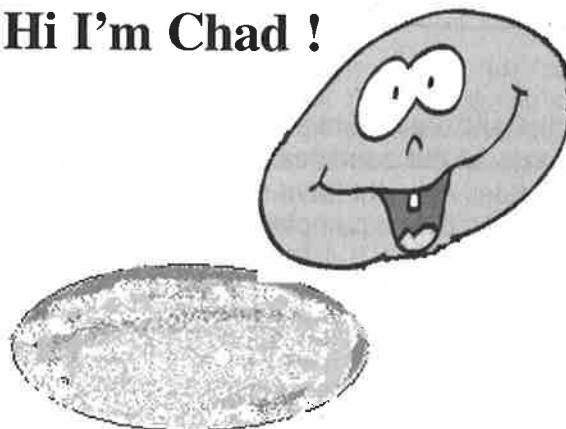

CITY ATTORNEY'S IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE R

This proposed Ordinance, if approved by a majority of voters, will increase the maximum utility-user tax rate from three percent (3%) to three and one-half percent (3½%) for residential users and from five and one-half percent (5½%) to seven and one-half percent (7½%) for commercial/industrial users. In addition, a utility-user tax rate of seven and one-half percent (7½%) shall be established for commercial/industrial users of water in the City.

The proposed Ordinance also requires, as part of the yearly budget process, that the City Council adopt a Resolution indicating how the general funds raised through the rate increase are being used. This Resolution shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation for the City.

The revenue generated from this utility-user tax goes into the General Fund of the City of Monterey Park. The revenue generated may be used for general City purposes, and the City is not legally bound to use the utility-user tax revenues for any special purpose or for any particular project or projects.

If approved by a majority of the voters, this proposed Ordinance shall take effect 10 days after the vote is declared by the City Council.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE R

With MEASURE R voters have the ability to provide the necessary funding to rebuild the City's two oldest fire stations & the public safety dispatch system, provide consistent staffing on our engines, and provide more officers on the street.

Voters will have an opportunity to give the City the resources it will need for **public safety**. The 0.5% increase for residents will equal only \$15 per year for increased Homeland Security items.

Voters have the ability to make their **voice count** through passage of Measure S, which advocates the new funds be spent on public safety. Measure R requires the City Council each year to tell voters where the funds from the increased UUT are being budgeted. This gives our public the ability to hold elected officials accountable for the precious dollars.

MEASURE R will provide for 100% exemptions for:

- Lifeline Rate payers
- Seniors over the age of 65
- Social Security recipients
- Disabled

With Measure R, Monterey Park residents will still have one of the second lowest rates for UUT. While no one enjoys paying more taxes, the need to improve critical services in police and fire leaves us no real alternative. A few years ago, the voters spoke loudly and clearly that public safety needed to be retained locally. That commitment must be maintained so that the men and women who risk their lives can save our loved ones when called upon.

Measure R is designed to have the least impact to residents, while moving forward with **security and improved public safety**. Voters recently said that trauma centers were important; this will help bring more paramedics to those in need of medical treatment and at the same time put more officers on the street to fight crime.

CITY ATTORNEY IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE S

This is an Advisory Measure. The purpose of Measure S is to advise the City Council of the Monterey Park voters' preference in allocating general funds raised by the increased utility-user tax rate proposed on this ballot. Measure S is solely advisory and shall not legally limit nor control the authority of the City Council in the expenditure of its general funds, including funds raised by the increased utility-user tax rate.

If approved by a majority vote of the voters, Measure S recommends that the City allocate general funds raised by the increased utility user tax rate (i) to increase police staffing by five (5) sworn personnel, (ii) to improve the public safety communications system for police and fire personnel, (iii) to increase paramedic staffing by three (3) sworn personnel, (iv) to rebuild fire stations No. 2 and No. 3, and (v) to maintain adequate reserves to address future homeland security needs as they may arise. Measure S also recommends that the City Council report to the community every year in a noticed meeting on how the funds are being spent to improve security or the medical needs of the community.

CITY ATTORNEY IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE T

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE LAND USE ELEMENT OF THE GENERAL PLAN

On July 18, 2001, the City Council adopted a comprehensive update to the City of Monterey Park General Plan. The update included, among other things, certain amendments to the Land Use Element of the General Plan. Monterey Park Municipal Code Chapter 21.78 requires voter approval of amendments to the Land Use Element of the General Plan prior to the amendments becoming effective. At a special election on November 6, 2001, the voters approved amendments to the Land Use Element of the General Plan. An amendment to one portion of the Land Use Element, however, was inadvertently left off the ballot. This Measure submits to the voters for approval the omitted amendment.

The General Plan update adopted by the City Council on July 18, 2001, indicated that the properties west of Atlantic Boulevard between Garvey Avenue and Mabel Street are designated Mixed-Use I. The Land Use Element amendments submitted to the voters on November 6, 2001, did not include this area on the map. If Measure T is approved by a majority of the voters, the southwest corner of Garvey Avenue and Atlantic Boulevard and certain parcels fronting Atlantic Boulevard, Garvey Avenue and Mabel Street shall be amended on the City's Land Use Element of the General Plan as Downtown Mixed Use (MUI).

Further, if Measure T is approved by a majority of the voters, the City Council will be authorized to adopt amendments to the City's Zoning Map, Zoning Code and Specific Plans consistent with the General Plan Land Use Element amendments without any further voter approval.

If approved by a majority of the voters, this proposed Ordinance shall take effect 10 days after the vote is declared by the City Council.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE T

As residents, we are concerned about our **quality of life** and the services we receive.

In November of 2001, voters gave overwhelming approval to a new sweeping and visionary General Plan that will improve neighborhoods, protecting open space, schools, provide new housing and attract Corporate America to this community.

The General Plan was developed with broad citizen participation over a nearly two-year process, a **true community effort** in planning our future. Outreach efforts for this new plan included a citizen survey, newsletter and newspaper articles, community workshops, presentations at schools, service clubs and extensive public hearings.

As a result of this effort, 65% percent of the voters gave approval to rezoning certain parcels for mixed-use development. This provides us the ability to create:

- Well Balanced and Quality Neighborhoods
- Provide **Affordable Housing** for young families and seniors
- Increase our fair share of sales taxes received from business
- Attract **national and regional retailers**
- Improve traffic and parking circulation

Measure T carries that same effort to about a dozen small parcels of land between Garvey Avenue and Mable Avenue. The description of these parcels was inadvertently left out of the last ballot question due to a clerical error. The General Plan Citizens Committee indicated that these parcels have been vacant and unproductive for the last 25 years. The only way we can expect this eyesore to be developed is by using a combination of housing and retail uses.

Measure T will allow the city to incorporate these benefits and maintain Community control.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF MONTEREY PARK, CALIFORNIA, RECITING
THE FACT OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION
HELD ON MARCH 04, 2003 DECLARING THE RESULT
AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW.

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of Monterey Park, California, on Tuesday, March 04, 2003 as required by law; and

WHEREAS, notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in general law cities; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY PARK, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the whole number of votes (ballots) cast in the precincts except absent voter ballots and provisional ballots was 4738; and

That the whole number of absent voter ballots cast in the City was 3454, the whole number of provisional ballots cast in the City was 154, making a total of 8346 votes (ballots) cast in the City.

SECTION 2. That the names of persons voted for at the election for Member of the City Council are as follows:

That the measures voted upon at the election are as follows:

Measure R "Shall an ordinance be adopted which increases the maximum Utility Users Tax rate by one-half percent (.5%) for residential users and by two percent (2%) for commercial and industrial users and which establishes a utility tax for commercial and industrial users of water at a maximum rate of seven and one half percent (7.5%)? The Utility User Tax provides for lifeline income and governmental use exemptions."

Measure S Advisory Vote only. "Should the City give priority to funding these services and programs from the increased utility user tax general funds: increasing police staffing by five (5) sworn personnel; improve the public safety communication system to provide for safer and cleaner transmission and reception of police and fire calls; increase paramedic staffing by three (3) sworn personnel; rebuild fire stations #2 and #3; and any other public safety programs that can assist police and fire departments in carrying out their duties and responsibilities in connection with Homeland Security?"

Measure T "Shall the City's Land Use Element of the General Plan be amended to designate the southwest corner of Garvey Avenue and Atlantic Boulevard and certain parcels fronting Atlantic Boulevard, Garvey Avenue and Mabel Street as Downtown Mixed Use (MUI) and shall amendments to the City's Zoning Map, Zoning Code and Specific Plans consistent with this amendment be authorized for adoption by the City Council?"

SECTION 3. That the number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City to each of the persons above named for the respective offices for which the persons were candidates and for and against the measures were as listed in Exhibit "A" attached.

SECTION 4. The City Council does declare and determine that: Mike Eng was elected as Member of the City Council for the full term of four years; Benjamin "Frank" Venti was elected as Member of the City Council for the full term of four years; and Betty Tom Chu was elected as Member of the City Council for the full term of four years; and

That as a result of the election, a majority of the voters voting on Measure R relating to a utility tax did not vote in favor of it, and that the measure was not carried, and shall not be deemed adopted and ratified; and

That Measure S, an advisory measure for Measure R, was carried by a majority of votes and would have been taken into consideration if Measure R had been approved; and

That Measure T, an amendment to the City's Land Use Element of the General Plan was carried by a majority voters and shall be deemed adopted and ratified as an ordinance of the City of Monterey Park as of this date and shall become effective 10 days thereafter.

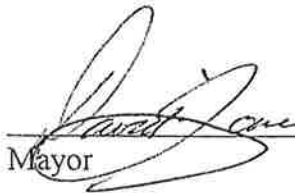

person was voted for; (5) The number of votes given at each precinct to each person, and for and against each measure; (6) The total number of votes given to each person, and for and against each measure.

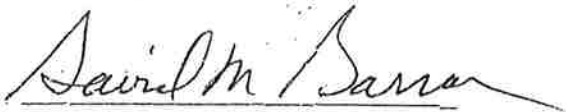

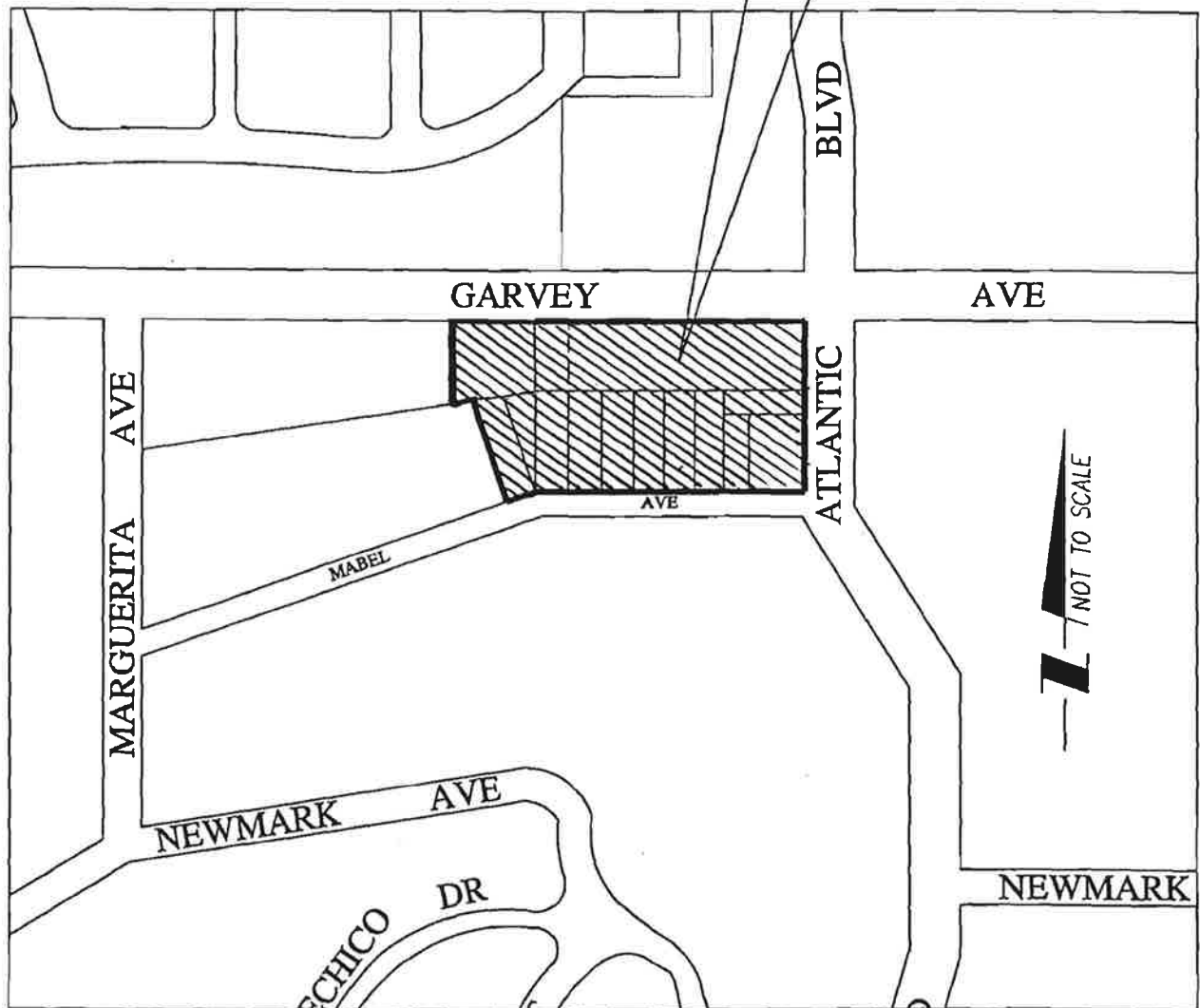
